Coming—where are we going?

In January we are beginning a series— "Things that are True." We have had a lot of good times getting to know one another and, hopefully, getting to know the LORD Jesus. Moving forward we are tentatively planning to have segments:

- 1. God is awesome—looking at His power and wisdom on both the cosmic scale and the microscopic scale.
- 2. Forgiveness—how to get past hurts---both how to forgive and how to apologize
- 3. Humility—appreciating others and having a realistic view of yourself.
- 4. Perseverance—Just Do It

We need:

- 1. Prayer warriors that will pray for the workers and for the teens.
- 2. Workers—we are always looking for people who want to make a difference in lives. If God is laying that on your heart, perhaps you should consider working with the Middle School Youth Group which meets Wednesday, 6:30-8pm

Attendance at WWJD averaged 31 for the month of December. During activity time, the children enjoyed working on Christmas crafts, including creating bead wreaths and coloring wooden ornaments. They also enjoyed singing Christmas carols each week between breakfast and devotional time.

On November 28, the children had learned from their puppet friend Mattie the Monkey about how Moses parted the Red Sea and led the Hebrews out of Egypt. On December 5, Pastor Steve explained another important event that followed: Moses went to the top of Mt. Sinai where God gave Moses the Ten Commandments. Discussion followed on how these Commandments tell us about how we should worship God and how we should treat one another.

Another puppet friend, Ribbity the Rabbit, visited on December 12 and told the story of David and Goliath

as found in 1st Samuel 17. Ribbity reminded the children that faith often comes in small packages, just as David knew God was with him and gave him strength when he fought and defeated the giant Goliath. At any time, we all can pray to God and ask for His help with the "giants" in our lives.

WWJD celebrated with a birthday party for Jesus on December 19 and enjoyed the special treat of donuts at breakfast. Adult leader Karen Jones opened the devotion time with group singing of "Happy Birthday, dear Jesus." Using specially-made figurines, Karen then told the story of the birth of Jesus, including explaining to the children that the name Jesus means "God saves." She asked the children to remember that the story lets us know that God loved us so much that He wanted to be with us in the form of His son, Jesus.
