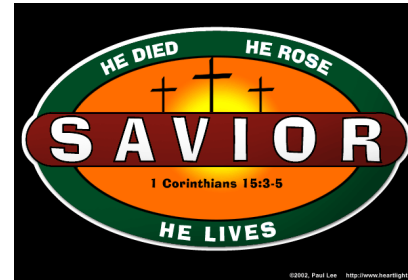

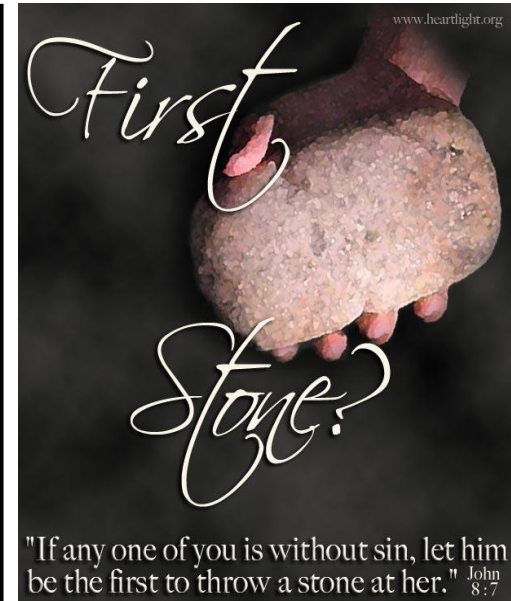

What Kind of Person Are We?

All through the Bible we encounter different types of people just as we do in our lives. You may have been introduced to someone this week at your place of employment and now you have to determine what kind of person they really are. For example we could consider Noah as just a man because as far as we know there was nothing unusual about his birth. It was not the subject of prophecy nor are there supernatural aspects of how he came to be. In fact all we know about Noah is about how he was as a man. We know nothing about him as a child or teenager but only his actions as an adult.

In reading about Noah we do find some remarkable statements. One of these statement is found in Genesis 6:9, **“This is the account of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked with God.”** In other words we learn that “Noah was just a man!” In my dictionary for a person to be considered as **“just”** he or she must be seen as **“honorable and fair in their dealings and action.”** Also they must be consistently moral, fair, and upright before God. In other words they are what the Bible refers to as **“righteous.”**

Sadly these qualities may be as rare in our day as they were in Noah’s day. It is sad to realize that a person does not have to be super-human to meet this definition of being a **“just”** person. When we refer back to Genesis chapter 6 we see that Noah was a unique person in the day in which he lived. He was a godly individual. So what was the rest of the world like?

The best way to answer that question is to read verses 11 & 12 of the same chapter that we considered a few sentences ago. Here is what the rest of the human population was like, **“Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways.”**

In Titus 1:8 Paul tells us that for a man to serve as one of the elders of a local church family that he must be **just!** Really! All of us who are members of the family of God are challenged to live justly and godly. That truth may amaze some folks but it is true and it is valid. Yet how can we truly become **“Just people?”** How do we because just? By obeying the gospel according to Acts 2:38. Any person who will obey Jesus can become a **“just”** person!
