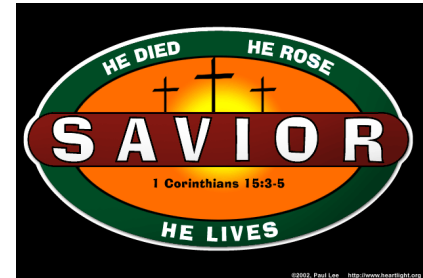

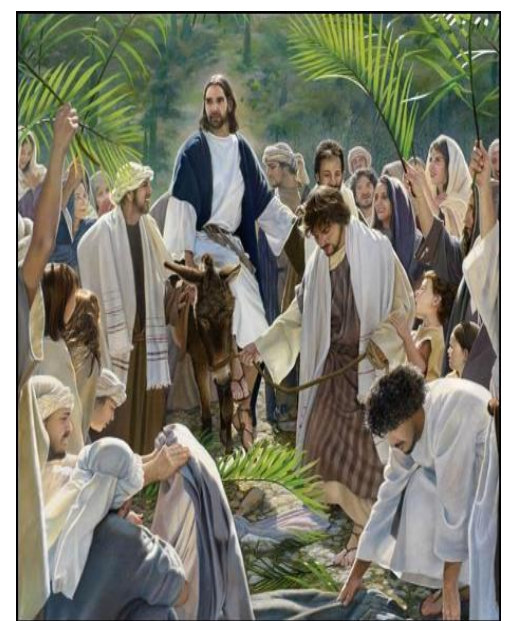

What are the benefits of retirement? Do you want to retire? Do you work more or less now that you are retired? I have heard all kinds of opinions about that phrase of life from a number of directions. Then I read something this week that stuck in my mind concerning the topic.

A guy was praising the benefits of retirement such as he and his wife's ability to travel as well as many other interesting things. However he claimed that the greatest advantage to retirement was that there were no schedules except those which were self imposed, and he could change those at any time. What stuck with me was how he expressed it. He said, "**the only way I know when Sunday comes is that the newspaper is thicker!**"

As Christians we are commanded by God's Word to share our faith with others. Frankly that is often very difficult to accomplish, and there are several barriers to doing it successfully. I think I know one of the main reasons why it is such a constant uphill struggle. It is because many people in our society think of themselves as being totally self-sufficient and independent. They have plenty of money, nice places to live, and excellent forms of transportation as well as friends and family. The way they view life they don't need what we have to share, they don't need the government, and they certainly do not need God!

None of their time is spent in worshipping God thus they have 365 days a year "**all to themselves!**" None of their time is spent in serving the Lord in any way. Also the very thought that some of their money could or should be given to God is almost laughable to them. However every day some newspaper, somewhere has some information about one or more of the folks who think the way we have described. The information will be found in the section of the newspapers known as the "**obituaries!**" Time has expired for one or more of these individuals. What was treated as an unlimited resource has proven to be much more limited than they thought.
