Cole has reintroduced the concept. He calls it "life Transformation Group" (LTG). It is

a simple way to release the most essential elements of a vital spiritual walk to people who need Jesus to change their lives from the inside out. It fosters transformation at the heart level and empowers believers at any spiritual level to accomplish the radical work of reproducing spiritual disciples who can in turn reproduce others.



What does it look like?

Group of 3: You and a few friends meeting once a week to talk about Jesus and experience Him together, while considering how to impact the world around you.

Pre-Christian: Try to include a seeker in your group so they can experience Jesus with you.

One hour: Meet for about one hour each week.

Same gender: This allows more authenticity.

Fun: Meet with people you enjoy.

No leader: You all learn together as equals.

Two absolutely necessary qualifications:

- * Desperate need for Jesus (Lk. 5:29-32)
- * Faithfulness in the process itself (2 Tim. 2:2)
