GALLERY LIFE IS EASIER WITH ONLINE PAYMENTS

Also at our November meeting, Eric Courtney outlined the updates he's made to our website's online payment section. When you open the website, click on the PAYPAL tab. There you will have two options: *Donate* and *Membership Renewal*. Choose your option and click on *Add to Cart*. Then follow PAYPAL's instructions. Donations are made in \$5 increments. Just click **+** until you reach the desired amount.

The Gallery pays a tiny transaction fee to PayPal for this service, so small in fact, that we are not concerned when weighed against the convenience of it all. However, if you want to avoid our having to pay it, and you have your own PAYPAL account, just log into your account, click on **Pay or Send Money**, then click on **Send to Friends or Family in the US**. Follow the simple instructions. The name of our account is citylightscoop@centurylink.net. DO NOT SELECT THE DONATE OPTION as that will involve the fee.

A FRESH START IN THE GALLERY FOR 2018 by Merle Williams, Gallery Director

Here it is December and a new year is almost upon us. We will start the New Year fresh with all new work in the gallery. This means that all work including cards and prints will be removed and replaced with new items. All new artists Record Sheets will be established.

We will be adhering to the gallery rules that are handed out to all new members when they join our Co-op. Stipulated in these rules are the policies that 10 sleeved (prints and/or original) and 25 note cards are charged as a full panel and 5 sleeved and 15 note cards equal a half panel. You must be a hanging gallery member to have sleeved art work and note cards in the gallery.

All non-hanging gallery members with art work in the Gift Shop must exchange their items and must pay \$10 per quarter. There is no hosting requirement.

The first quarter for 2018 (only 2 months as March is, again, our Juried Show) will have art intake on January 5th and 6th. **As we have no hosting calendar started for January, we will need hosts for Jan 2nd through 7th. Please notify me (Merle) or Libby if you can help on any of those days.**

I have found art, sleeved art work of non-members, of non-hanging members around the Gallery and gift shop. Some artists are way in excess of the 10 allowed items. So, with this endeavor to clean out the old and bring in the new, we are looking forward to seeing some new member art work in the gallery in 2018.
