#### **Symposium Facilitator**

Annette Mountford, MBE studied at the University of Southampton, St Thomas's Hospital, London, and Westminster College, Oxford. She worked as a Health Visitor for 13 years loving the challenges presented by working in some of the most deprived areas in the country. In 1992 she combined her experience in health, education, and parenting to introduce to the UK the American 'Nurturing Programme for parents'. She created the charity 'Family Links Educational Programmes' in 1997 when there was only one other parenting programme in the UK, overcoming British resistance to such work. The Nurturing Programme promotes emotional literacy and emotional and mental health. As CEO she led the Family Links team in adapting the Nurturing Programme for use in schools, prisons, the armed forces, and for work with Muslims, parents, and teenagers in the community. Family Links achieved nationwide reach as a training organisation. Annette helped write the 'Parenting Puzzle' for parents and wrote 'The Antenatal Nurturing Programme'. She received the MBE from the Queen for her work in 2002. More recently she has worked pro bono for Charity Mentors, mentoring CEOs of small Oxford charities, and became Chair of the Board of Trustees in 2018.
