From the Pastor's Desk

It's that time of year. I drove down the highway and saw 2 turtles, walking in their 'turtle' way down the road. I was tempted to stop and pick them up and set them by the side of the road, knowing that it was just a matter of time until a car hit them. As I thought about those two turtles, I thought 'Why would a turtle walk on the pavement?' He was safe in the grass. There was lots of food to eat in the grass—none in road. The grass is cooler. So, why would a turtle venture out on the road. The answer is simple—it's easier to walk on the road than having to contend with the grass, the uneven terrain, the sticks and rocks. It's easier!

We look at that and want to say to that turtle, "The easy path is not always (or rarely) the safest path. Stay in the grass—there is nothing for you on the road. And the turtle looks up and says simply, "But it is easier—I'll take my chances."

We can see how foolish that course is for the turtle, and yet, how often do we take the easy way? How often do we say, "If it's hard, it can't be the best path." Or if we are Christians, "If it is hard, I must be doing something wrong—God would surely make it easy." Jesus said, "13 "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. ¹⁴ For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few." Mt. 7

Why is the Christian life hard? Can't God just make it easy to be a Christian, easy to follow Jesus, easy to live for Him?

There are several reasons the Christian life is hard. First, we are in a spiritual battle: "11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day." Eph. 6

Second, we are fighting our 'sin nature': "21 So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. ²² For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, ²³ but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. 24 Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?" Romans 7

Remember always that water takes the easiest path, but God is calling you to be a man or woman that will stand for Him in world—and that is not easy.

How are we to study the Bible?

We are to study it prayerfully, knowing and trusting that the Holy Spirit desires to guide us into all truth. We are to study it thoughtfully, meditating upon the text and utilizing the ability of reason and research to understand the text. We ae to study it consistently, realizing that as we expose ourselves to the teaching of the Bible wed will gain greater and greater insight. We are to study it applicationally, so that we become 'doers of the Word and not hearers only.' Above all, we are to study it in faith.

How are we to understand the Bible?

We are to understand the Bible literally (recognizing the nature of different types of literature—we understand figures of speech), grammatically (realizing that language has boundaries of interpretation and meaning), historically (realizing that God is unfolding His plan and purpose in the world), contextually (realizing that we are obligated to understand both the train of thought of the author and the times of the author).

I left to travel to Nebraska and Iowa to visit two of our five children who happen to have five of our (newly) seven granddaughters that Sunday afternoon. As I traveled and throughout my visits I was also in contact by phone with both our daughters; because, I found, all are undergoing intense trials. Conversations were emotional and very tender, and I felt God's sovereign hand in the timing of each moment we spent. I was overcome with, and able to express to our kids, a truth which utterly anchors our faith: though GOD never promises "heads-up" knowledge of what He is doing and how things will unfold. He commits Himself fully to being and doing Good for us throughout every trial. He is on our side. He is for us. In the midst of hard situations, He is With us and gives us all we need to make it through the circumstances and come out looking more like Jesus! When I was a child learning to play the piano, one of the difficult things for me to understand was when the music had notes so close together that they sounded discordant. I would stop and check, and check again thinking I was playing the wrong note because the notes clashed. My mother would hear this and come to me at the piano and say: "You are playing the right notes, Mary Kay...it's just not a good stopping place!" Trials and testing times in our lives are meant b the LORD to "forge our souls with unbreakable strength and wisdom", as we move through life. They are not meant to be a good stopping place!

Secretary's Report:

April Secretary's report reviewed. Cindy made a motion to approve and was seconded by Justin; motion approved.

Treasurer's report:

Income \$3033.84 expenses \$2033.02. Total Assets \$80,638.18 (Railroad Stock not included as it was not available at the time). Report was reviewed Jason made a motion to approve; Beth seconded; motion approved.

Old Business:

Russell presented bids for the replacement of the roof and will have a congregational vote on May 20th.

In a special meeting it was suggested that the church pay up to half of camp fees for the children going. Not exceeding the amount needed for camp. Jason made a motion; Beth seconded with no objections.

New Business:

Mowing cost was discussed and Cindy made a motion to continue paying our share of the cost with the cemetery board; Jason seconded and none opposed.

May 20th the congregation voted on the roof repair. Sue Burlingame made a motion to have Nolt's Construction replace the roof with standing seam metal with snow guards and to remove the chimney to below the roof line. Dale Taggart seconded and the vote was unanimous. Color samples will be presented and voted on later.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING - MAY 20

It was approved on May 20 to begin the roof process. Approved was Nolts Construction's bid for \$15,800, with the snow rail for an additional \$350. Galvanized painted snap-lock metal over top of existing roof. Will have 40-year manufacturer warranty. Concealed fasteners on roof on metal and trim. Tower will be flashed underneath existing siding. All edges of roof will be properly trimmed with same color as roof after decision made. Metal samples will be provided for viewing to help in the color selection at a later date.
