Pastor's Pen

At a recent Tuesday Bible study (7pm—all are welcome), we looked at a passage in Mark 5. Jesus had healed a man possessed with a legion of demons and the man's response was to desire to come, follow and be with Jesus. But, Jesus would not allow the man to come but said, "Go home to your friends and tell them what great things the LORD has done for you and how He had compassion upon you." (Mark 5:19).

All of us, if we have walked with Jesus very long and if we have prayed many prayers, have seen Him do great things for us. Certainly, our first response ought to be to bow before Him in thanksgiving, acknowledging what He has done for us. When we recognize that He has answered prayer and give thanks, it both builds our faith and gives Him glory. But beyond that, if we are to follow the example of this one in Mark 5, we are to tell our friends the great thing that the LORD has done for us. When we tell others about how and when God has protected, provided, led, healed or whatever else He has done, it encourages our friends and family to look to Jesus to meet their needs.

Take a few moments and prayerfully review your life. When have you seen God do something special to meet a need? Think about what was happening and why you felt incapable to handling life on your own. Think about how it felt to see God help you. Take time to remember and thank Him for His faithful care—thanksgiving will build your faith. Then ask Him to give you an opportunity to share with someone else 'the great thing He has done in your life.' Look for the opportunity or opportunities that He will give you to glorify Him.

Sometimes we might feel awkward if we are not used to talking about what God does in our lives. But you can begin the conversation by saying, "Did I ever tell you about the time God answered my prayer?" I am certain that He not only wants to do things for you, because He loves and cares for you, but that He desires you to tell others so that they might be encouraged to look to Him in time of need. It is good to know that Jesus will never leave us or forsake us.






Read: Psalm 1

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

April report was reviewed and Andy made a motion to approve the minutes. Dale seconded the motion. Vote taken and passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Income for April 2019 was \$7,747.32, expenses were \$2,147.40. Total assets were \$70,074.56 (minus Union Pacific stock). Justin made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Andy. Vote taken and passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

The candles in the front of the church were discussed. As they burn the candles can become uneven and/or get very short. A suggestion of purchasing mechanical candles that remain the same height were previously discussed and Andy offered to do some research into options. These options were reviewed along with their prices. Andy made a motion to leave the candles and maintenance as is. Justin seconded the motion and the vote passed.

Daily Bread Magazine order has arrived.

Heating and Cooling system bids are still being collected. One bid has been received and reviewed. This subject was tabled until the next board meeting when additional bids are expected to be available.

NEW BUSINESS:

Several light bulbs in the basement are needing replaced. Current fixtures in the basement were discussed and Dale offered to look into LED bulbs and conversion kids.

Sam's Club membership is up for renewal. After some discussion, Andy made a motion to allow this to expire. Dale seconded and the vote passed.

Summer Fill pricing from AA Propane was quoted at \$1.379. Andy made a motion to go ahead and fill the tank at this price. Justin seconded and the vote passed.

The Sunday service opening announcer for the month of June was decided with Dale being selected board member.

August Ice Cream Family Time was set for August 4th at 11:30 a.m. The Traub family will be hosting.

The next board meeting will be on Monday, June 24th at 7:00 p.m.
