### From Pastor Steve's Desk

We are living in turbulent times. We are seeing our country in many ways being torn apart by Republican vs. Democrat, Rich vs. Poor, Black vs. White. It seems that there is no 'common ground' for discussion. It seems nearly impossible to see things from another's point of view, to listen to others, to build understanding and make progress. When I was a young pastor, I came to the realization that I needed to be able to minister to old and young, to rich and poor, to Republicans and Democrats. The only way I could do that was to make Jesus and the Gospel central. There are a few things that we, as Christians, are called to do.

First, realize that no one is right in everything or wrong in everything, except the Lord Jesus and the Word of God. Paul reminded us, as believers, that our ultimate unity is found only in the Lord Jesus when he said, "For in Christ Jesus you are all sons [and daughters] of God, through faith. <sup>27</sup> For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put Christ. <sup>28</sup> There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. 29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise." (Galatians 3). As Christians we find unity and relationship not in our political views but in our relationship to Jesus.

Second, we need to be honest, and what I mean by that is call out both sides for those things that are wrong and to be willing to commend both sides for those things that are right.

Third, we need to be "quick to hear and slow to speak and slow to wrath." (James 1:19) Don't assume but invite openness and conversation. I remember a conversation that I had at B&Ts some time ago. We were talking about baseball over coffee and a gentleman came in and informed me that I was a Republican and that he disagreed with what I thought.

No one had been talking politics and I had not expressed any opinions other than about the Cardinal's game. When that man assumed he knew what I believed (and then proceeded to argue with it), there was nothing to do except walk away.

Finally, we are commanded to love even our "enemies." Love means that we wish them well, that we listen to them, that we hear their hearts (and not just their tone or their words). Love desires the best for them and the best is not found in either Republican or Democrat policies, but in the grace, the hope, the strength we can each have in Jesus through faith.

## Mission Fest, Sept. 20




On September 20<sup>th</sup>, we had a combined service for MissionFest at


## **Youth Groups**

Moniteau Church Board meeting minutes, August 24, 2020

In attendance: Andrew Rohrbach, Kevin Coffelt, Beth Fennewald and Pastor Steve. Dale is recovering from surgery; Mark had an accident at work and was in the ER—we prayed for them.

Andrew Called the meeting to order and Pastor Steve opened in prayer.

1. Treasurer's Report was examined for June and July. July income was \$12,476.34 (which included a \$3,400 donation to cover Moniteau Kids Camp) expenses were \$7,318.02 (which included kids camp expenses). The total balance as of July 31<sup>st</sup> was \$84,546.41. There was a discussion about camp finances, Andrew has not finalized the expenses but thought the expenses were covered with some left over. Each month was approved.

#### Old Business:

- 1. Kevin in working on the Broom closet, will discuss with Diane and build it with the help of Mark Baepler.
- 2. Pricing for new windows in the basement was carried over—no new information.
- 3. Kid's camp was a success—pictures will be mailed out. The camp shirts were donated saving expense.
- 4. Printer was discussed and will be put in basement—needs to be picked up in Jeff City
- 5. There was a discussion of the piano and a suggestion that there be a hymn sing on a regular schedule to reach out and for fellowship. Beth will contact Steve Wittenburger about the piano and a decision to move the organ to the balcony.

#### New Business:

- 1. There was an update on the improvement projects. Mark and Andrew redid the floors in the sanctuary. Andrew will be contacting someone about repairing cracks in sanctuary and painting. Beth will be checking on carpet cleaning and cleaning the pew pads. Kevin is doing some research on additions and the possibility of a ramp.
- 2. Elevator will be inspected and the bill paid—approved by the board
- 3. There was a question about the thermostat—but the electric bill has not been exceptionally high so will keep an eye on it.

- 4. Discussion of Mission Fest. Andrew updated the board on the combined Mission Fest Sunday. It was suggested, because of Covid that perhaps reserving the Community Center and Shelter in Jamestown would permit more to come with social distancing. Andrew will be checking on reserving the Center and Shelter. Based upon the ability to reserve those facilities, people will be recruited for different tasks—decorations, clean up, drinks. It will be a carry in with Moniteau hosting. It was suggested that there be a hymn sing from 10-10:30 followed by the Service and then the meal.
- 5. There was a discussion of the way the offering is collected and it was agreed to leave it as it is for the time being.
- 6. The Needy Family collections will be the second Sunday of every month. Pastor Steve will contact Sue about the program and put together some guidelines with Sue.
- 7. Began discussion for future Board member—Beth will be off the Board in December.
