We support the Dettman's Ministry—this month I wanted to highlight what God is doing that we are a part of through our giving and prayers. They use 'Name' instead of a country's name.

God is Moving in NAME

Last semester, we had the incredible privilege to see God work in amazing ways in our city. We shared the Gospel with over 250 students, and we saw six of those students decide to follow Jesus. That is HUGE anytime, anywhere, but it is unheard of during the first semester on campus, especially in the NAME region. We have been blown away by God's lavish love and faithfulness. Take a minute now and praise God, give a shout, do a little celebratory dance (we do!). We serve a living God who is pursing you and me and his children everywhere, and lives are being changed because of it. We began following up with our new brothers and sisters and saw some of them take awesome steps of faith, including sharing their faith with their friends. We developed many relationships with others that are interested in the truth of His Word, and we'll have opportunities this next semester to continue to share Jesus with them. We also grew in love and unity as a team, as well as in our confidence and ability to share the love of God with others. We also wanted to share with you a glimpse of how God is working throughout the greater NAME region. At our conference, we had a few days to connect specifically with those working in NAME in order to encourage one another, share stories of struggles and victories, and help one another overcome obstacles we were facing. As part of this time, every team was asked to share how the work was going. We learned that this last semester in our region, our teams were on 85 campus, had spiritual conversations with 2,570 students, shared the full Gospel with 1,609 students, and saw 34 students decide to follow Jesus! God is moving in amazing ways, and we can't wait to see how He continues to build His church in NAME this year!

Coming—where are we going?

We will celebrate Ash Wednesday March 6th at Moniteau. During the period between Ash Wednesday leading to Easter we will be looking at Jesus 'last words' to His disciples, John 14-16. Someone has said, "Last words are lasting words." These words of Jesus set his disciples and us in a life changing, world changing mission. Take time to read through these passages and pray through these passages.

Confirmation

We have a confirmation class at Moniteau Advent with 7 young people. We meet on the second and fourth Sundays of the month in the afternoon and are looking at what we believe and building habits for the future—habits of reading the Bible every day, prayer, fellowship and witnessing. We are memorizing verses for each of those areas and are writing a personal doctrinal statement on the Bible, God (who He is and what He is like), Jesus, Salvation and the church. February Board Report

The Moniteau Evangelical Advent Church board met on February 25th, 2019. Present were: Pastor Steve, Cindy Wieberg, Beth Fennewald, Justin Traub, Dale Taggart, and Andrew Rohrbach. Meeting was opened with a prayer.

Agenda Approval:

The meeting agenda was presented and approved. Cindy made the approval motion and Andrew seconded. Vote taken and passed.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve went over his report on the month's activities. The mileage and expenses were presented and approved.

Secretary's Report:

January report was reviewed and Cindy made a motion to approve the minutes. Andrew seconded the motion. Vote taken and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Income for January 2019 was \$2,805.44, expenses were \$3,810.64. Total assets were \$64,446.98. This number includes the interest of the Union Pacific stock, but the value of the shares were left out. Andrew made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Dale. Vote taken and passed.

Old Business:

Cindy provided an update concerning the insurance coverage of cemetery vandalism. The current coverage is for \$5,000 with a \$1,000 deductible. This coverage currently costs \$19 annually. Our insurance company pointed out that the church does not have workers' compensation coverage. Cindy is following up with them further to get additional information on the price of this additional coverage.

Water and Temperature sensors are still not working. Cindy has not been able to get ahold of a representative to provide assistance. Dale has volunteered to continue working with the contact information that Cindy has available.

Beth provided an update on the Evangelical Association dues which have been paid.

Andrew will continue to schedule piano players. Alden Rohrbach will continue to play.

Pastor Steve verified the Confirmation Class was being held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 1 PM to 2:15 PM.

New Business:

Changes to offertory procedure were discussed. The ushers will remain in the back of the church until the response begins to be played.

California Democrat letter arrived asking for Easter service information. Beth volunteered to respond with our information. Cindy will deliver.

Church Safety Check was completed by Kevin Coffelt.

The next board meeting time was confirmed to be on March 25th at 7 PM.

We are still unable to find the primary source of the cancer so I am hoping the Immunotherapy will make it visible or simple kill it! Prayers are the best medicine.
