#### From The Pastor's Desk

May 9<sup>th</sup> is Mother's Day—a day we set aside to honor our moms. There is so much that could be said. Mothers carried us for nine months, nurturing us as God formed our bodies. Ps. 139 says,

"For You (O God) formed my inward parts; You knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.

Wonderful are Your works; my soul knows it very well.

My frame was not hidden from You, when I was being made in secret"

God knit us together as a craftsman makes a work of art (and we are a work of art). Recently, I met my newest grandson, Caleb Mathis Watson. I know that science tells us that a sperm from the father and an egg from the mother combined and the process of cell division and differentiation took place over the next few weeks and then the organs, bones, muscles, nerves, eyes began to mature and develop. It is an amazing thing, that the cells differentiate at the right time, in the right place, in the right way so that what is born is a complex body with a multitude of different cells with different functions.

It is a marvelous thing for the Lord to use a woman's body to form a new life and then entrust that new, eternal life to the care of a mom (along with a dad)—to feed, to teach, to protect, to prepare for life. One of the great joys and responsibilities of a parent is to help the child come to know and love the One that formed him/her.

In Proverbs 31 we are told of all the things that a mother does from caring for the house, making and caring for clothes, providing food for the family, doing business, caring for those that are less fortunate, helping her husband become respected, being wise, but the author of Prov. 31 concludes:

<sup>30</sup>Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

<sup>31</sup> Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.

The one characteristic above others which affects everything else she does is being, "a woman that fears the LORD." That is more than being religious, it is having a deep understanding of who and what God is, of loving Him and having a growing relationship with Him, of putting all of life in the proper perspective under His authority.

<sup>14</sup> How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? Our children began to be taught a simple gospel presentation through LifeWay's VBS curriculum, the **ABC's of Salvation**.

**ADMIT** to God that you are a sinner. **BELIEVE** that Jesus Christ as God's Son died on the cross for your sins and rose again from the dead. **CONFESS** your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

#### **Youth Groups**

Due to COVID, we did the best we could to work around school closures and other events. It continues to amaze Ben, Kim, and I the numbers that come each and every week. The only thing I know is the participation has nothing to do with the leaders and everything to do with God's hand blessing our community. Each week the youth are well behaved (well...for the most part), courteous, and attentive. We even had a guest speaker go out of their way to mention how well behaved and respectful they were. For me, because we have such great participation it's kind of convicting for I feel like there is always more I could do to foster spiritual growth.

It's hard to remember back but we actually didn't start meeting until October by request of the school. We started in Proverbs talking about how wise men and women conduct themselves. Each week we covered a different topic ranging from anger to diligence to handling money. I had a lot of fun studying for each week as Proverbs has a lot of great practical advice.

Right before winter break, we asked the youth to write down a question they had about their faith, the Bible, or really just anything relating to God. These questions fueled our discussions for the entire spring semester. For us leaders, this was much more difficult to prepare for as many of the questions required us to do research and others required careful well thought out answers. Luckily, the Smith family agreed to help with several of the history /creation/dinosaur related questions. This was invaluable to us leaders and I learned as much as the youth during those discussions!

Overall, we have had a great year. It is always sad to see a good group of seniors graduate but I know we have several freshmen coming up that will be great members!

Lastly, we are very excited about going on a mission trip this summer to Westfield, IN. We are working through an organization called Group Workcamps. We will stay in a school, sleep on air mattresses in the classrooms, eat in the cafeteria, and have nightly worship services in the gym. During the day, we will go out into the community and work on houses of low income and elderly people. The combination of service, powerful nightly sessions, and simply being away from home and the daily grind of life puts everyone's heart in a vulnerable position for the Holy Spirit to work.

Please pray for Ben, Kim, and myself. There are times during the year when youth group can be frustrating, discouraging, and overwhelming. These seasons come and go but we need people praying for us. We also need people praying for the upcoming mission trip. Pray for safety and spiritual growth for the youth and adults alike. Thank you all for your continued prayers and for the incredible support we get from our church family.
