From The Pastor's Desk

We look at the world and wonder what can be done. t seems that the problems are so big and the direction of the country is so wrong. It seems that people have lost their senses (at least it often seems that way to me). What can be done? God has given us the powerful tool prayer that has the potential to change people one person at a time & in changing people, changing the world.

For the next few months, we are going to try to harness that tool by the 'Who Is My Neighbor' magnet. We want each family to have one, to prayerfully identify your neighbors and then pray for them consistently, believing that your prayers can change their lives. There are nine squares to fill in—so designate four of them your 'church neighbors'. People generally sit in the same place each Sunday. There are people to the right and left, in front and behind you. They are your 'church neighbors' and they need your prayers. The house you live has people that are your neighbors. They are your 'outside church neighbors.' But, what should you pray?

Often we pray for health. But everyone is 'body, soul and spirit' and to only pray about someone's health is to miss praying for their 'soul and spirit.' Paul prayed for the Colossians (people he had never met, only heard of), "we . . . have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so that you will walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please Him in all respects, bearing fruit. . . increasing in the knowledge of God; . . . strengthened with all power" Sometimes I take a passage and pray it. In Mt. 13 there is the parable of the hard, rocky, weedy and finally good soil. I pray for people that God would make them 'good soil' so that the Word of God grows in their lives.

Recently we received a letter from some missionaries that we support that minister to Indians asking us to pray for "Glory (that is the young lady's name) has another baby on the way. They will be only about nine months apart. Please pray she chooses Jesus instead of addictions and abuse. Pray she chooses to be a loving substance free mother to these two little ones.

MONITEAU EVANGELICAL ADVENT BOARD MINUTES – NOV 2022

Moniteau Evangelical Advent Church Board met on November 28, 2022. Meeting was called to order by Mark Baepler. Also present were Pastor Steve, Kathy Gerlach, Diana Watson, Kevin Coffelt and Paul Fennewald. Pastor Steve opened with a prayer.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor Steve's report was presented for review.

Working with Ministerial Alliance on Thanksgiving Service which will be at New Hope this year.

WWJD – T-shirts were ordered for them with WWJD logo. One adult has asked to be excused from helping with WWJD, so additional adult supervision is needed there.

Middle School Youth Group still needs adult help.

He will be starting a class on Childhood Spirituality through Dallas Seminary.

Has been in contact with St. John's Church in Florence, who recently left the UCC and changed their name to St. John Evangelical Church of Florence.

Secretary's Report:

The October meeting minutes were submitted for review. Paul made a motion to accept the minutes; Diana seconded. All in favor.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer's Report for October was presented for review. Income for the month was \$8563.03; expenses were \$5,792.78; and total assets were \$98,842.20. Kathy made a motion to accept the report; Kevin seconded. All in favor. Paul noted that Alden has been paid for the additional electrical work for the outside lighting. He will order the new tables/chairs before Christmas. Materials for the new manger for the church float came to approximately \$245. Paul noted the bank has a special 18-month CD now with interest rate of 3.45%. He would like to discuss with the bank about cashing in our 5 CD's and putting those into 2 CD's at this higher rate. There would only be a \$30 charge to cash those in and we would get a higher interest return on the CD's. All board members agreed this would be beneficial to the church.

Old Business:

Discussed getting an estimate from Kilmer Siding to replace basement windows, new plexi-glass over the stained glass and replacing the rear door behind the sanctuary.

Discussion on potential board members; agreed to have Melisa Rohrbach and Justin Traub presented at Annual Meeting. Discussed concerns with board meeting times preventing some from being able to serve.

New Business:

Annual Meeting is coming up and Mark will be preparing the agenda. Mark asked if we should bring up if there's a need to put a time frame for leaving people on the prayer list. All agreed to just continue as we have been.

Mark asked Kathy to check with Longfellow's about replacing the burning bushes that were planted last year.

We will have snacks following the Christmas Eve service. Beth and Kathy will prepare the punch; Kathy offered to get the plates and napkins for it. We'll ask the congregation to bring snacks.

Steve had shared an email with Mark from a church in Columbia that had a semi-load of donations that they wanted to get to rural communities that had needs at Christmas. Mark had emailed the church but has not heard anything from them yet as to what is available, or if anything is still available.

Kathy asked if the Dettmans mailed newsletters to some church families as some people have referred to receiving updates by mail. Steve and Paul indicated they get a quarterly one emailed to them, so they assume that's what is mailed out. They will start forwarding these to Kathy so she can email to all our church families.

Short discussion on whether to continue supporting the Salvation Army. Decided to table the discussion to next month.

Discussion on potential pastor/janitor bonuses. Pastor Steve declined saying it was not necessary. Mark was unsure if his family wanted to continue as custodians and

will check with them. He did not feel a bonus was necessary for them. The board decided later in the meeting they would provide Pastor Steve a gift card to Baker Creek Seed Company. Paul will pick that up.

Discussion on bonuses for the 3 church pianists and how to split them. (Decided on \$600 for Alden; \$300 for Diana and \$100 to Dillon.)

Discussion on the Sunday School's request for T-shirts to be purchased for the kids. The board noted they already allocate up to \$300/year to both the Spit and Sugar & Spice groups for supplies. No one has submitted any expenses this year so those allocated funds, up to \$600, can be given to the Sunday School to use. The board also agreed to make the same annual donation to these groups for 2023.

From Mary Kay

Over 40+ years of being married to a pastor, I have done some thinking and re-evaluating just what "my part" of ministry is in our local church body. I came into the role of "pastor's wife" naively...believing I was marrying Steve and that my role was to be just his wife. Unfortunately, perhaps, after all these years, I still believe my role as "pastor's wife" is to just be Steve's wife. My role in the church, however, is what it was before I was married—to use any area of giftedness to build up the body into closer relationship with God through a closer relationship with the Lord Jesus. Through the years being a part of the church, I've had a number of opportunities to take various "tests" to identify my strengths and weaknesses and my spiritual

gifts. Though each has been slightly different, what I have understood my greatest "gifting" is has not changed. Before I ever took any spiritual gifts "test", I understood and had confirmed by many where my "gifting" or strength lay. In I Corinthians 12 the terms used are "through the Spirit is given a word of wisdom, a word of knowledge." This gifting is what drives me to write monthly in hopes of stimulating you to think about God's word, take it seriously, let it mold and change lives. Most of you are probably familiar with the children's song: The wise man and The foolish man. Are you aware that in the passage of scripture that the song is about, it doesn't say that building your house on "the rock" means knowing Jesus or even following him. The scripture says building your house upon the rock means knowing and UNDERSTANDING what God says! Understanding what God says involves knowing God, knowing His Word (written and the Person of Jesus), understanding how to LIVE God's Word, and doing what His Word says...this in every way is about a living, continuing, constant relationship with God the Father through Messiah His Son (the God-Man) empowered by the Holy Spirit of God. I get so excited about reading God's word, and as I read, listening to His voice within speaking to me! He is so beautiful in every way to me as He speaks truth, questions me about what I think and why, sometimes just soothing a sore heart and letting His Spirit hold me tight to His heart with His words. I have found fairly often in my life, that my spoken words combined with my excessive introversion, have been heard to be offensive and hurtful...which is why I write and not speak...NOT a good speaker! But, somehow, the Lord helps me write thoughts in a way that is easier to receive. And though it is terribly hard for me to write, it also seems that God gives me what to say each time. Reading from Numbers 22:21-25:18 and then from Luke 2:1-35 on the same day, I wrote the following in my journal: "I look at these passages in Numbers and Luke and think about the part Balaam (Numbers), and Mary and Joseph (Luke) had in God's plans. They were given certain specific "jobs", "roles", "gifts" as it were in today's lingo. They weren't told the whole of it, nor even necessarily much about the necessity of their part in the whole. They were given a part to do before the Lord, and were accountable to Him for doing it or not, and also accountable for HOW they did their part. Through the years, I've questioned what "my part" should be in the local church (which

for me means the church(es) my husband pastors. The conclusion I've come to that gives me peace, helping me sort through is that God has given me a great love for His word, and an honest understanding and doing of it. Speaking from that perspective—leading with that goal in mind is my "part." Sometimes, this leads me to ask hard questions and this is and has been difficult for people at times. Proverbs 27:17 says: "iron sharpens iron." Hebrews 10:24 says: "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works..." Although I don't believe I am completely lacking in feelings of mercy, my role in the church is to confront other women with what God has confronted me with in His word about my life, and to attempt to "stir you up" to obedience (love and good deeds).

I also feel strongly that my part in the church is primarily to minister to other women of all ages. That being the case, here are three little nuggets I found I would like to share with you wives, mothers, grandmothers, sisters, daughters...

Proverbs 11:17 "...Your own soul is nourished when you are kind..."

Deuteronomy 4:9 "...Be very careful never to forget what you have seen God doing for you.

May his miracles have a deep and permanent effect

May his miracles have a deep and permanent effect upon your lives!

Tell your children and your grandchildren about the miracles he did."

And Deuteronomy 6:12-13; 8:11, 14 remind us that times of blessing—when our lives are going well—are the most dangerous to us spiritually: "When the LORD your God has brought you to the Land he promised...and has given much...then beware lest you forget the Lord...when you are full, don't forget to be reverent to him and serve him." And: "...But this is the time to be careful! Beware that in your plenty you don't forget the LORD your God and begin to disobey him..."

"Plenty" is relative, but, truthfully, ALL of us in our country are living in "times of plenty" and thus, dangerous spiritually! Interesting that God knows his people tend to forget him when things go well; He knows we tend to view him as our "panic button." He desires more with us. Surely, the times at the end of the year, are a good time to build into

our lives memorials-simple routines that help us remember to who we owe everything.

One last gem from the Lord, just for women: Proverbs 12:4 "a worthy wife is her husband's joy and crown; the other kind corrodes his strength and tears down everything he does..." I do love that..."the other kind"...and don't want to be her! How much better to have said of me that my Lord found me a "worthy" wife to the man he gifted me with!
