Wednesday, December 10, 2025

The regular monthly meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Vice-President J Hazelwood.

MOTION BY B KALLHOFF, SECONDED BY RICH NAGEL TO APPROVE THE AGENDA WITH ONE NEW BUSINESS ITEM – SAFEGUARD FROM ABUSE POLICY – ADDED. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

Secretary's Report: Minutes for November council meeting were published in newsletter and emailed to Council prior to meeting. **MOTION BY RICH NAGEL, SECONDED BY M CHRISTESON TO APPROVE MINUTES. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.**

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's Report was emailed to Council members prior to meeting. Financials reflect a year-to-date deficit of \$27,412 in expenditures. The \$20,000 of authorized line of credit has been used towards this deficit to pay expenses. (\$20,000 line of credit owed to the bank is part of the \$27,412 deficit.) Checking account balance is \$185.00.

A \$20,000 CD was purchased with a six-month maturity date for funds received and designated as "Parking Lot Fund."

MOTION BY A WERNER, SECONDED BY S KREUGER TO APPROVE TREASURER'S REPORT. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

Pastor's Report: Several special worship events including Thanksgiving service and the beginning of Advent. -- Confirmation classes and Jr high youth gathering with Pastor and Scott as chaperones. -- Participated in various meetings, community events and continuing education. -- Made pastoral calls. (see attachment)

New member Sunday will be December 21, New members: Kevin Kamps, Alex and Cassidy Battcher, Noah and possibly one other.

Transfer membership out of Zion to All Saints Lutheran, NYA: Kevin and Nancy Biermann.

Board of Deacons: M Christeson – Decorated Church December 23 with thanks going to those that helped. Will be filling Christmas goodie bags this week. Decorations will be taken down January 4 after church.

Board of Stewardship: S Schilling – Nativity Stroll had 77 nativities from members for viewing. \$571.00 was received in donations and meal purchases. -- Hunger Jar for December will be for Feed My Starving Children as well as the December 21 Clattering Coins collection. December 31 will participate in a Feed My Starving Children event. Several bags of Elephant Jo coffee remain for purchase.

Board of Trustees: Rich Nagel – L Schiroo has feelers out for water detection devices in basement. – Water fountain in basement under Narthex is malfunctioning. Trustees will try to repair before contacting a repair service. – Will be looking at main entrance heater as blower is not working as it should. – L Schiroo discovered when he was in attic that a vent screen is off and needs to be replaced. -- Replaced frosted privacy material on south bathrooms. -- Working on quotes for handicapped entrance door as proposed by the Memorial Committee at the November meeting. Confirmed with Council that the intention was handicapped door and opener. Will report back when quotes are received.

Board of Worship and Music: A Werner – Music and hymns were chosen through January.

Board of Education: S Krueger -- Statutorily mandated Safeguard training for individuals working with youth has been completed by three individuals and must be completed by three additional individuals. -- Made banner baptismal shell for baptism banner last Sunday for Weston Fredin -- The Sunday School Christmas Program will be Sunday, December 14. -- There will be a Youth Lock-In this January in Hutchinson.

Standing Committees

President Gieseke dispensed with Standing Committee reports for all except Constitution. Constitution -- President Gieseke did request the Council think about considering changing By-Laws to policies. -- President Gieseke read a document to the Council from the SW MN Synod Council with recommended Constitution amendments and where the information can be found on their website. (see attachment)

Old Business

1. Proposed 2026 Budget for Annual Meeting – Rich Nagel presented the proposed 2026 budget from the Trustees and Treasurer. The budget was reviewed. Council discussed that more benevolence is given by Zion than reflected in financial reports because some giving does not come out of the general budget checkbook and perhaps groups within the church donating funds from their checkbooks should be included in the year-end report to the Synod. This can be reviewed by the Treasurer and other groups, i.e., ZCW, Sunday School, etc. for future years.

MOTION BY ROSEANN NAGEL AND SECONDED BY B KALLHOFF TO APPROVE PROPOSED 2026 BUDGET AS PRESENTED AND TO BRING SAID BUDGET TO THE ANNUAL MEETING FOR FINAL APPROVAL BY THE CONGREGATION. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

2. Nominating Committee Report – L Gieseke – List of nominees was handed out. Nominations for Council Secretary (elected), Sunday School Superintendent (appointed) continue to remain open. Two members to the Nominating Committee are needed and Michael Christeson and Starla Schilling have agreed to be on the ballot per recommendation of Constitution to have two outgoing Council members on the ballot for the Nominating Committee. **MOTION BY S KRUEGER AND SECONDED BY L GIESEKE TO APPROVE PROPOSED BALLOT OF NOMINEES FOR ELECTION AT 2026 ANNUAL MEETING. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.**

3. Parking Lot Committee Report – B Kallhoff – Parking lot fund has now reached \$68,350.00 – Eighteen bags of coffee remain for sale – Chicken Dinner fundraiser committee will be setting date for some time in March 2026.
4. Minnesota Paid Leave Law – Employees have been notified of their rights under the new MN law. Appropriate accounts have been created and the Council Treasurer will act as the Administrator and contact person. Employees are eligible to apply for paid time off beginning January 1, 2026 through an application process to the State of MN and employer is notified when State approves.
5. Funeral Policy -- The current Funeral Policy addresses non-funeral home funerals indicating a checklist for those funerals without the assistance of a funeral home. The checklist will be an administrative working document that can be revised by staff from time to time as deemed necessary to make funeral planning as easy as possible for the family during their time of bereavement. -- It was determined that Funeral Policy stipends and fees need to be reviewed. L Gieseke will review and compare with Wedding Policy and General Policies for consistency between policies and bring recommendation to January Council meeting.
6. Safeguard Policy – Board of Ed member S Krueger presented the “Safeguard from Abuse” proposed policy. This is a State mandated policy to protect youth from abuse. (see attachment) **MOTION BY ROSEANN NAGEL AND SECONDED BY L GIESEKE TO APPROVE THE “SAFEGUARD FROM ABUSE POLICY” INCLUDING TRAINING AND BACKGROUND CHECKS. THIS POLICY TO REMAIN ON FILE WITH OFFICAL CHURCH POLICIES AND PUBLISHED ANNUALLY IN THE YEAR BOOK. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.**
7. Council Spending Limits – Reviewed Council Constitutional spending limit for non-budgeted items. (2019 Constitution C12.05.a (second a))

New Business

1. 2026 Annual Meeting -- **MOTION BY RICH NAGEL AND SECONDED BY S KRUEGER TO SET THE 2026 ANNUAL MEETING DATE FOR SUNDAY JANUARY 11, 2026. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.**
2. Installation of Officers will take place January 18, 2026.

Adjournment: MOTION BY S KRUEGER AND SECONDED BY L GIESEKE TO ADJOURN. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE. Meeting adjourned by Vice President J Hazelwood at 8:43 p.m.

When life gets out of control

In September 2024, a North Dakota teen's car malfunctioned, becoming unstoppable and reaching 113 miles per hour. For 40 minutes, 18-year-old Sam navigated a bridge into Minnesota, intersections with train tracks and highways, small towns and — almost — the road's dead end.

But after Sam called his mom and 911, multiple first responders gathered. Police drove near him, staying on the phone and calmly asking about the accelerator, emergency brake and remaining gas. Ambulance crews were ready. The highway patrol laid speed sticks to puncture the tires (it didn't work) and cleared intersections ahead of the runaway vehicle. All the while, Sam's mom prayed. Finally, an officer sped ahead so Sam could run into his squad car, bringing his own to a halt.

Not making light of what could have turned tragic, sometimes our lives get out of control too. We speed through work, school, relationships, parenting — trying to accomplish, achieve and gain faster than others. We cram as much in each day as possible, seemingly unable to slow down. The harried pace can endanger our physical, mental and spiritual health.

Often, we're "saved" only as people who care come alongside us to help. Perhaps family members express concern, professionals suggest remedies, loved ones pray for us. Finally, when all we can do is crash into the loving care of God, we come to rest. It may take time to recover emotionally, to dare get back "behind the wheel," to trust life to carry us at a safe speed again. But thanks be to God for placing support systems around us when we need them most.


