In this song, Herb Brokering gave us words to sing about many of the ways God is praised in creation, and in all manner of things, and even in our work!

Larry appointed S Krueger to take meeting minutes

Devotions were provided by Pastor Gretchen.

Motion by J Pedersen, seconded by M Strobel to approve agenda. Motion approved by voice vote.

Secretary's Report: Minutes for July council meeting was published in newsletter and emailed to Council Members. Motion by P Schiroo, Seconded by J Hazelwood to approve amended meeting minutes. Motion approved by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was forwarded to council members via email. Treasurer stated offerings have trailed off significantly over summer, and things are not looking as good as they had been. Motion by J Pedersen, seconded by S Kumar to approve financial reports as emailed. Motion approved by voice vote.

Pastor's Report: Pastor provided a report on all that she has been working on the month of July. August 25th will be Blessing of Backpacks and Sept 18th will be confirmation orientation. Arlington Community Thanksgiving Eve Worship service will be at Zion in November.

Bd of Stewardship: Reported that Time and Talent sheets will go out on 10/13, and be due back by 11/3, Clattering Coins will be on 09/08 and will go to Sibley Co Food Share, 09/15 will be Fall Birthdays, hoping to get in at Feed My Starving Children yet this fall, and working on something for Veterans in November.

Bd of Deacons: No report. J Pedersen reported that they would be meeting on Sunday after church.

Bd of Trustees: M Strobel reported that they are getting together with Mueller's for a very rough estimate on the parking lot. Tilling up, and seeding where trees were removed. Fairgoers were pretty considerate and didn't leave much garbage behind in parking lot. Caution tape was put up around the perimeter of the lot to keep from parking on grass. Nuessmeier Electric came and fixed the electrical box in the back of church. They wired and put a new box where electricity feeds in to the pump.

Being Christ amid Pain

In December 2023, a tanker truck carrying 9,000 gallons of gasoline tipped on its side in Totona, Liberia. For two hours, a party atmosphere ensued as people living in poverty rushed to gather gas dripping from the vehicle. But then, the tanker suddenly exploded. Dozens of people died instantly or were severely burned. Thousands have endured deep trauma and grief. How could life go on? Where was God?

Yet, life did go on — not easily, but in this way: Medical staff and others rallied to care for all who were suffering physically and emotionally. A nearby church held comforting worship services, and its choir went to homes to sing messages of hope. Parishes and disaster-response ministries sent teams from near and far to support people through post-traumatic stress, income loss due to disability, the birth of babies whose young fathers had died in the blast, children's transition back to school and more.

These Christian caregivers and comforters couldn't bring instant, perfect healing. But by connecting with people who were grieving and struggling, they have become the presence of Christ.

Where is God? There, in the midst and aftermath of pain, working unceasingly to bring new life.
