

Zion Lutheran Church Church Council Meeting Minutes Wednesday, May 8, 2024

The regular monthly meeting was called to order at 7:06 p.m. by President Larry Gieseke.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Minutes for March council meeting were published in newsletter and <u>emailed to Council</u>. <u>MOTION BY B KALLOFF, SECONDED BY M STOBEL TO APPROVE MARCH MEETING MINUTES AS PRESENTED AT MEETING. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.</u>

Treasurer's Report: March Treasurer's report was forwarded to council members via email.

MOTION BY M STROBEL, SECONDED BY S KRUEGER TO APPROVE MARCH
FINANCIAL REPORTS AS EMAILED. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Many successful events and activities this past month. Some highlights: Attended MN Valley Conference meeting, Zion hosted South Africia Vrhyeid, CRT Origins/Academy. Working on Confirmation review and planning, pre-marriage preparation, advance worship planning, summer gatherings, etc. A Vrhyeid representative will be in attendance at the June 7 and 8 Synod Assembly in St. Peter. June 13 will be Constitution Camp in the Cornfield. Has completed Synod "Boundary Training," which will be valid for three years. (Written report—Attachment)

Board of Deacons: Absent--No report.

<u>Board of Stewardship:</u> J Rowe – Have an upcoming meeting. The outdoor clean up and pot luck went well and much was accomplished. Backpacks were turned in with Zion exceeding its goal of backpacks collected.

<u>Board of Trustees</u>: M Strobel – All but one of the air conditioner units have been replaced. Work continues on the electrical needs and the fellowship hall air conditioner unit. – Bifold doors between classrooms and dining hall have been repaired – Water heater under the fellowship room sink (services kitchenette and main floor bathroom is malfunctioning. It will be looked at to see if repair is possible and if not a new unit will need to be purchased. – East property flags mark where tree donated by Darrell and Jackie Alsleben will be planted – The two evergreen trees donated by Pr. Jim and Ann Carlson have been planted. – Re-roofing is now anticipated for next week (again, weather permitting).

<u>Board of Worship and Music:</u> S Krueger – Met in April and have now set monthly meetings rather than past practice of quarterly meetings. Discussed Beer & Hymn event, additional summer

(weekday) service, bulletin format, reviewed Easter service and rotating Lenten services.

<u>Board of Education</u>: Cindy Hebeisen (S.S. Superintendent) – plans for Vacation Bible School are underway with committees appointed. Dates are July 14-17 with the theme "Saints & Holy Helpers" – Discussed Confirmation for next year but do not currently have a recommendation to present to council.

Standing Committees

President Gieseke dispensed with Standing Committee reports as none were submitted.

Old Business

There was no old business.

New Business

Maranatha Church has requested the use of Zion's basement dining hall for an additional evening (Tuesday). MOTION BY R NAGEL, SECONDED BY S KRUEGER TO GRANT THE ADDITIONAL EVENING OF TUESDAY TO MARANATHA CHURCH FOR THEIR WORSHIP TIME. A LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING WILL BE DRAFTED BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, APPROVED BY COUNCIL AND PRESENTED TO MARANATHA TO DOCUMENT THE USE OF THE FACILITIES, OUTLINE ZION PRIORITY EVENTS AND OTHER DETAILS TO SUCCESSFULLY CONTINUE THE PARTNERSHIP OF MARANATHA AND ZION FOR USE OF ZION'S FACILITIES. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

Pr. Pierskalla presented the current "Planning Your Wedding" brochure to the council with recommendations for updating. MOTION MADE BY J ROWE AND SECONDED BY S KRUEGER TO APPROVE THE PRE-MARRIAGE BROCHURE CHANGES BY (A) ADDING SMOKE, VAPE AND DRUG FREE LANGUAGE TO THE ALCOHOL FREE POLICY IN BUILDINGS AND ALL OF CHURCH PROPERTY. (ALCOHOL PERMITED FOR RELIGIOUS PURPOSES ONLY); (B) PREMARITAL COUNSELING "WILL" FULFILL THE TWELVE HOURS REQUIRED BY STATE LAW TO RECEIVE MARRIAGE LICENSE APPLICATION DISCOUNT; AND, (C) UPDATE FEES. MOTION APPROVED BY VOICE VOTE.

The "Policy" section (pages 6, 7, 8 and 9) of the 2024 Yearbook was briefly reviewed with several inconsistencies noted. Discussion was tabled until the June meeting. All council members should review the policies and be prepared to work on updates.

Next council meeting is Wednesday June 12, 2024 at 7:00 pm.

The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.





Don't be root-bound

As a new gardener, Jan Riggenbach used to treat bedding plants with extreme care, setting them into soil without disturbing the roots. Eventually she learned that rough — even ruthless — treatment is better in the long run.

"If the plant has been growing in its pot so long that the roots are circling the bottom, I jab my finger into the bottom of the soil and pull down to untangle the roots," Riggenbach wrote in her gardening column. "If the whole pot is filled with circling roots, I have to be merciless. I don't worry if I break some of the roots. That's better than allowing the roots to continue to circle when the plants are growing in the garden."

In the same way, it's easy to grow complacent and inward-focused in our walk with God. But bunched-up roots can't reach out for sustenance. So for maximum faith growth, dare to let God shake you up from time to time!
