Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

When we move into the month of March, we in the church experience a rather striking juxtaposition of dark and light. At the time daylight is getting longer, the sun shining higher in the sky, and patches of earth reappearing from under the melting snow, in the church we are slowly descending into the darkness of Lent, working our way to Holy Week and the absolute darkest day of Good Friday with Jesus hanging on the cross and dying for our sakes.

As I sit at my computer putting together the worship services for the coming weeks, trying to create experiences that you will find meaningful for the season, Molly, my cat, is finding entertainment with three robins, who have seemingly returned early and who are exploring the patch of snow-pressed grass that has appeared above the underground, heated parking garage of my condo building. Molly runs business-like between a full-length perch at the top of her cat tree against

the patio window in the living room quickly scooting full speed to sit in my bedroom windows, unable to contain her instinctual excitement. I, on the other hand, feel solemn as I immerse myself in the biblical texts of the Lenten season. Why the light and the darkness come together like this in the month we emerged from the winter doldrums perplexes me, but these months and the calendar of the church year are long-standing, so we observe as scheduled.

During our Lenten Wednesdays, we will be hearing from the "artisans" of the crucifixion, those who created with their hands the items used on Jesus. We will hear their thoughts about what they have done, and even their questioning of their involvement in the process. If we were to have been alive at this time in history, would we also question our involvement? Would we have been shouting "Crucify him, crucify him?" Would we have stood silently by watching in pleasure or horror? Or would we have fled like many of Jesus' disciples?


We will have a brief introduction to a musical service, Holden Evening Prayer. We will only learn the Evening Hymn and the Final Blessing with the rest of the service being adapted and spoken so as not to overwhelm you since you've not done this service before. You will find these two songs easy to catch on to. And we will sing them each Wednesday so you will become more familiar with them each week.

On Maundy Thursday, you will be offered Individual forgiveness. I don't know if you've done this in the past, but it is a part of the traditional Maundy Thursday service. That will be followed by Holy Communion and the undressing of the altar. You will be asked to leave in silence.

On Good Friday, we will hear about the various choices made by those who crucified Jesus along with coordinating Bible texts and hymns. All of this should ready us for a joyous Easter resurrection celebration.

I invite you to take this Lenten journey with me. As the light and warmth increasingly fill and surround our world outside, may we descend into the Lenten darkness assured that light and hope are found at the end of the cross and grave.

<u>Meeting closed due to confidentiality of Call Committee Report</u>. All attendees not designated as Council members by the Constitution were asked to leave for this portion of the meeting.

Meeting opened when Call Committee report concluded.

Motion by J Ebersviller, seconded by S Kumar to approve Call Committee report and accept recommendation of committee for Candidate of Choice. Motion passed by voice vote.

Motion by R Nagel, seconded by N Schiroo to set Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 26, following the church service with the agenda of voting to issue a Letter of Call to the Candidate of Choice to serve as Zion's Pastor. Motion passed by voice vote.

Memorial Committee representative, Lorraine Mielke, reported 2022 end of year balance \$4,904.47 of which \$500 were donations to the Memorial Fund in 2022. Restricted funds for bathroom project 2022 end of year balance were \$21,549.23. One Memorial Board plaque will be purchased for Ramona Evenson pursuant to policy.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Minutes for January council meeting were emailed and available at meeting. <u>Motion by L Rud, seconded by S Kumar to approve meeting minutes. Motion</u> passed by voice vote.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: January Profit and Loss financial statements were emailed and available at meeting. <u>Motion by L Rud, seconded by J Ebersviller to approve the report as sub-</u><u>mitted</u>. <u>Motion passed by voice vote</u>.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pr. Evelyn presented a verbal recap of the past month. Attended: ZCW General Meeting, various Bible study groups. Confirmation date set for May 7. Has Ash Wednesday and Lent services laid out. Private infant baptism set for Sunday, February 26 after Special Congregational Meeting. Super Bowl souper Sunday food shelf donations competition will take place. Planning a project "Clattering Coins for Christ" for coin donations to go to food

Zion History

October 24, 1975

Dear Friends at Zion:

As I look back on the three and a half years that I was your pastor I recall the many wonderful experiences that made those years significant in my life.

It is your life and witness to God the Father and Jesus Christ which has formed you into the Communion of Saints that you are today. By word and example you testify to the Grace of God which gives purpose and meaning to your life. I saw this evidenced by your faithful attendance at worship each Sunday as you gathered to hear God's Word and received the Sacraments as God's spiritual gift which creates and sustains your faith.

I think back to a congregation seeking to serve a changing community. Church Council meetings often found us discussing new ways to minister to a congregation that was no longer serving only farming ramilies, but had re-located in a growing town of commuters, businessmen, and laborers as well. I recall with fondness the zeal with which you welcomed new families into your fellowship. You spoke with pride that you were exceeding expectations for congregational growth.

The results of a pastor"s service to the congregation are often difficult if not impossible, to measure. Certainly there were new ideas being tried during my years with you: splitting the Sunday school into two sessions to accomodate the growing enrollment, individualized catechism instruction to increase the personal awareness and knowledge of the Christian faith and doctrine, the 40% increase in membership during those years, the undertaking of a Debt Retirement Fund Drive that has brought you from \$25,000 indebtedness down to \$4,00 in 3 years (and perhaps the goal can be reached by your 10th Anniversary of Relocation?) children's sermons, youth ministry and adult study classes.

How does one measure a congregation or a pastor? One plants, another waters, but it is God alone who gives the increase and gathers the harvest. I do believe the efforts and accomplishments of a congregation and their platter give some indication of fife. However, they are not the last word.
