

## SWITA Awarded \$50,000 to Improve Access to Healthcare

COUNCIL BLUFFS- Transportation can often be a barrier to accessing healthcare. To help address this, Southwest Iowa Transit Agency (SWITA) will soon launch a pilot program in partnership with Methodist Jennie Edmundson and CHI Mercy hospitals in Council Bluffs called SWI-Ride. This new program is intended to aid transportation to and from scheduled medical appointments with healthcare providers at these two hospitals. The Iowa Department of Transportation has awarded a \$50,000 State Transit Assistance Special Project grant to SWITA to help with scaling up the pilot program.



"Reliable transportation is one of the most common—and most challenging—barriers our patients face when trying to access care," said Tara Slevin, President of the Jennie Edmundson Foundation. "We see firsthand how difficult it can be for individuals to get to scheduled appointments, particularly when financial constraints limit their options. Our partnership with SWITA and CHI Mercy Hospital reflects a shared commitment to addressing that challenge. This State Transit Assistance grant, secured by SWITA, is an incredible step forward in helping bridge transportation gaps and expanding reliable access to care for patients across Pottawattamie and Mills Counties."

SWI-Ride seeks to provide a transportation option for patients that have barriers identified by healthcare partners to ensure they have access to their medical appointments. The launch is tentatively set for mid-February and will operate Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. It will initially be limited to rides within Pottawattamie and Mills Counties.

## Health Care Transportation Continued...

SWITA, Methodist Jennie Edmundson Hospital, and CHI Mercy Hospital are providing matching funds over and above the \$50,000 state grant to start the program.

SWITA is based in Atlantic and has a vehicle hub in Council Bluffs and serves 8 counties in Southwest Iowa with over 100 vehicles and approximately 70 drivers. It is Iowa's largest rural public transit service in terms of the total number of rides provided each year, averaging 550,000 rides annually and growing.

## Two New Homes Set to be Placed in Anita from Homes for Iowa Program

ANITA – The Anita Development Corporation accepted a recent delivery of a new home from the Homes for Iowa program to be placed in The Meadows development in Anita, with a second home on the way.

Anita Development Corporation partnered with SWIPCO, the Cass County Board of Supervisors, the Cass-Atlantic Development Corporation, and The City of Anita to spring this housing development to life at the site of a former trailer park on Sun Valley Road. The first home that was delivered was a three bedroom, two bathroom layout containing 1,200 square feet of living space. The house is being set on a crawlspace foundation and a double-car garage will be added to the site along with a paved driveway before being sold. Another home with the same specs is being delivered soon for placement on another lot in the development.

Homes for Iowa is a nonprofit partnership with Iowa Prison Industries that trains incarcerated individuals in the building trades, giving them practical experience by building homes onsite at the Newton Correctional Release Facility. Those homes are ordered or bought by various entities seeking housing options and delivered directly onto the foundation on the buyer's lot. Revenues received from the sale of homes is put back into the program to pay for training. The program helps offenders gain valuable skills that may help them obtain employment following their release. Even those who don't remain in the trades after release, benefit from the structure and sense of achievement they gain.

SWIPCO served as a liaison between Homes for Iowa and Anita Development Corporation to bring these homes to the community and also recently assisted with a home delivered to the City of Massena. The program has since transitioned to work directly with housing partners, but SWIPCO would be happy to help any interested parties get connected with Homes for Iowa representatives.

The SWIHTF Homeownership Assistance program opened for 2026 on January 2nd. These funds can help income eligible individuals purchase a new or existing home. Assistance is 7% of the purchase price, up to \$8,000. The first \$5,000 is a 5-year forgivable loan, forgiven 20% per year. ### **HEY LEGISLATORS!**

First of all, if you're reading this, THANK YOU! At this time of year you are inundated with requests, pamphlets, emails, letters, and everything else, so if you are taking the time to pick up our newsletter to stay informed on what is happening at SWIPCO, we greatly appreciate it.

Second, keep an eye out for the budget line item in the state legislature for assistance to councils of governments (COGs). There are 17 COGs in Iowa, of which SWIPCO is one. We do a variety of things and are by no means the same, but we really are one of the few entities that regionalize government services (SWITA is a great example, it makes no sense for one county to run a transit system, but 8 together works really well) and in this time of budget cutting and looking for economies, COGs stand ready to help make as much sharing as possible—with the participation and consent of our members, the Cities and Counties of Southwest Iowa.

### **6,602**

That's the number of telephone calls fielded by the transit staff in November. That includes clients calling to set up rides, or to cancel, drivers calling in, and all the wide variety of things that are handled in a given day. Of those calls, 4,558 were to the Atlantic taxi service alone. In total, that was over 100 hours spent simply on the phone. Each one of those calls is important, and each one represents an opportunity to improve someone's quality of life in our region. Great job transit managing all of that!

### **GRANTS**

This is a gentle reminder that we are more than happy to help our members with grant writing services—we do it all the time. Usually that is free, sometimes we do have to charge for more complex programs, especially if they require a community survey or special study before they can be completed. We are coming into a very busy season of grant writing and we strongly encourage you to reach out now if you want that assistance so we can get you on the calendar.
