Be sure to stop in at the Market Square Building to view the 1913 Flood Memorabilia Exhibit. Larry Suttman and Gary Petticrew are collecting items to place in the showcases and will display photos showing the destruction of the flood in Miamisburg.

MARCH 28: Historical Society General Program 7:00 pm, Market Square Building

The program, "The Great 1913 Flood" will be hosted by Carol O'Connell with able assistants Larry Suttman, Carolyn Kilpatrick, Diane Warrick and Judy Wuerstl. The Great Flood occurred one hundred years ago on March 25, 1913. The PowerPoint presentation follows along with a letter that was written by Ida Eck to her sister immediately after the flood. It will bring to life the tragic experiences, the survivors and the devastation of the flood. This was the worst disaster that ever occurred to Miamisburg and other towns and cities along the Great Miami River. Refreshments will be served following the program.

John O'Gorman has written a book that chronicles events of the Great Flood. Copies will be available for purchase. He plans to be there to sign them.

This is a MUST SEE program and book. Don't miss it!

JUNE 9: Spotlight on the River

Mark your calendar for the final tribute on June 9. Boaters are invited to launch their boats at the Linden Avenue landing and take a leisurely 2.5 mile cruise on the river to Rice Field. Boaters will then disembark and return to town for many activities which include the following:

- Hop on the mini-bus and take a narrated ride of the flood sites. A guide will relate the history of the buildings and who the occupants are today.
- Step in the Market Square Building and view the exhibit your last chance.
- View DVDs of the *History of Miamisburg* and a documentary of *The Flood in the Miami Valley*.
- Enjoy entertainment at the bandstand with music of the early 1900s, such as Shine on Harvest Moon, By the Light of the Silvery Moon, Peg O' My Heart.
- See old boats on display along Miami Avenue at Riverfront Park.
- Board the University of Dayton RiverMobile a learning studio focusing on our region's water resources.
- Visit vendors along the way and meet author John O'Gorman, who will sign a copy of his recently published book, *Impact of the Great 1913 Flood on Miamisburg, Ohio*.
- Bring your chairs and reserve your spot at the bandstand for our first community concert of the season.
- There are more activities to be confirmed for Riverfront Park.

We Really Need This!

Gary Petticrew is a very handy guy to have around. Not only is he the Assistant Curator and the Membership Chairman, but he is also the computer whiz-kid who solves all our problems in that dark place I do not want to go. One of the fun things we do is sit in the office and bounce ideas off each other: "Why can't we do this?" "We should try doing that!" Some very worthwhile ideas are born right here, and have become useful tools.

One 'strategy', that was so obvious we walked into it and received a really nasty bump, was the fact that while we store a huge wealth of knowledge in our files, the public - our visitors, see that 'wealth of knowledge' only as a conglomeration of stuff, because it's off limits to them. Something is wrong with that picture! We're going to change it!

Gary and I have in mind a set of books - three ring binders, with clear plastic sleeves. These 'books' will contain about every category of life in Miamisburg, right back to 1790. This set of books will be available to all visitors in the Sweny Research Room.

For example, there will be a section on physicians - every physician who has ever practiced in our town, and the same with dentists, lawyers and merchants. And not just people, but enterprises as well. We will feature restaurants, groceries, saloons, drugstores, hotels, tobacco warehouses, stables, churches and flour mills. We'll include the companies that produced twine, machinery, wheels, toys, cigars, knives, buggies, autos, airplanes, pitchforks, ice and farm equipment. And we even printed our own money!

We will limit, to just one page, the name of a person, place or thing. If there is more information, visitors will be referred to the proper source. If at all possible, we will include a photograph. We will also make an effort to show our source of information.

In conjunction with this project, we will also be building a Miamisburg 'Time Line'. This clever little thingumadoodle will tell you when was the first time for anything in Miamisburg. When was the first train through Miamisburg? When were the first electric lights? When was the first concrete sidewalk? When was the first brick house? When was the first ferry in operation? When was the first swimming pool? Who was the first shoemaker in Miamisburg? And on and on. It should be interesting and long overdue.

Now to the good part. You, our members, can help build this directory of Miamisburg's past. The years after 1930 are no problem, but if you have information, stories, news clippings or photographs of historical interest from the earlier years before 1930, that you think may be fascinating, let us know. We may very well want to make a copy for our new directory. This could be in reference to any of the above mentioned (there wasn't room to include everything) or anything or anyone to do with old-time Miamisburg. Remember, photographs are priceless. John O'Gorman Authors Book on 1913 Flood

While we're on the subject of the 1913 Flood, we're proud to recognize Society member, John O'Gorman, who has authored a book on the subject. It's entitled, *Impact of the Great 1913 Flood on Miamisburg, Ohio*. The book will be published and available for purchase at the Market Square gift shop and at our General Programs.

John has invested a great amount of time in researching the flood and compiling information from many sources into one, easy to read, account of the disaster that overtook our town 100 years ago. It contains personal stories of heroism and descriptions of the panic, horror and devastation endured by our citizens during those bleak days in March.

John has included many photos taken at the time of the flood and more photos of the monumental destruction. In addition to documenting the flood itself, he follows up with describing the actions that were taken in the years following, to ensure that this event was never repeated.

You will also discover a fact, not known by many, that contributed greatly to the extreme height of the flood in Miamisburg. I'll let you read the book to find out why the flood would not have been as bad here, if it had not been for one, very important contributing factor.

John O'Gorman's book is a must for anyone who is interested in the history of Miamisburg. It is a very well documented account of the days and the weather leading up to the flood, the flood itself and the effects of this historic event on our town. You'll want to hand this book down to your children and grandchildren!

Do you know of anyone who has a boat for our 1913 Flood display? Society member, Wayne Burgett, is constructing a National Cash Register boat. The historic significance of this boat is that John Patterson, founder of NCR, on March 25,

1913, began building the boats to rescue stranded people. A boat was constructed every 7 minutes.

We will display old boats, such as canoes, rowboats, fishing boats and rafts. Anything that would float and people *could have* used for rescue efforts. They don't have to have been in use in 1913.



Silver Taps will be held Thursday, May 23, 7:00 pm, at the Market Square Building.
