Halloween Pranks in Miamisburg Back in the 1800's

An Excerpt from "Miamisburg -The Story Of Our Town"



"What mischief did the youngsters of the 1800's get into around the Halloween season? According to 11 year Sid or "Dale" Hecker, who kept a diary of those years, we had a pretty good time Halloween. People nearly all took their gates off. (Back in those days, most yards were surrounded with an iron, picket or paling fence.) We hid them if they had the kind of hinges that come apart. We had to promise not to upset any privies and not to carry any gates away.

Out at Ike Eagle's we thought we would run away with his express wagon, but when we got close Ike came from behind the barn with a shotgun and asked what we wanted. We told him we didn't want anything. He told us to get out of there or we would get something we didn't want. (We ran away.) The next morning there was a buggy atop the Big Four Depot. They must have taken it apart to get it up and then put the wheels back on."

Hieronymus Family Foundation Makes Donation

Lifetime Society member, Lee Hieronymus, and his brother Ted, have announced a donation of \$150,000 to the Campus Quest fund. Campus Quest is a project currently underway to privately raise funds to build a new sports complex for Miamisburg High School.

The Hieronymus name is well known in the community. Our "one room schoolhouse" (the Kercher Pioneer Home) is dedicated to Harriet Hieronymus, mother of Lee and Ted. She was an educator, historian and direct descendent of one of the earliest settler families in this community.

The family has always supported education in Miamisburg, and various other non-profit organizations. Their father, Ted, passed away in 1972 and their mother, Harriet, in 2004. Lee and Ted (son) are proud to make this donation to Miamisburg Schools on behalf of the Hieronymus family.

Are You Keeping Up With the New Historic Miamisburg TV Shows?

If you're a faithful reader of *The Tavern Log* you'll know that within the past few months a new Media Production Group has been formed. The group is in the midst of recording new programs on a regular basis, with Carol O'Connell as the moderator in the first two tapings. An additional program has been recorded with Mayor Dick Church as moderator and Bobbye Sweny as guest. It will be aired in the near future and promises to be a lively and entertaining interview titled 'Memories of Miamisburg'.
