The Miamisburg Historical Society is beginning a brand new tradition this year for our annual fundraiser. We're hosting a German Fest that includes lots of musical entertainment, dancing, food, beer and soft drinks. Dedication Ceremony To Be Held at Hill Grove Cemetery Veterans' Memorial




BENCH DONATED BY RICHARDS MONUMENT



At The Gift Shop – Very Limited Supply!

These Limited Edition banks are replicas of the Baltimore Gas & Electric Company's Horse-Drawn Pump Wagons. The Ertl Company, Inc., maker of scale models, has produced a limited quantity of this horse-drawn pump wagon bank. This is the 7th edition in the series.

For the first part of the 20th century, horse-drawn wagons were a big segment of the B.C. & E. Company's fleet. This pump wagon is representative of the type of vehicles used to draw moisture out of gas mains. In late 1924/early1925, the pump wagon became obsolete.

Ertl was an American toy company best known for its die-cast metal alloy collectible replicas (scale models) of farm equipment and vehicles. It was based in Dyersville, Iowa, home of the National Farm Toy Museum. In the 1990s, Ertl moved their production facility to Mexico, but maintains their distribution facility and outlet store in Dyersville. The bank comes with a certification of authenticity. Ertl Company will not produce this exact unit again and does not allow anyone else to produce it.

An Excerpt from "Miamisburg - The Story of Our Town"

"Lost in limbo is the old Miamisburg Cedar Grove Cemetery which once lay along Sycamore Creek at Sennett Street between Sixth and Eighth Streets. Seven acres of land purchased from Jacob Kercher had been fenced, platted and planted. But as years went on the ground was found to be too wet and bodies were washed out by the creek. When Hill Grove Cemetery was opened in 1864, the ground was sold and most of the bodies removed, although excavations for walks on Sennett Street sometimes turned up bones. Settlement of an estate disclosed the fact that the son of Emanuel Gebhart, one of the founders of the town, was buried there."





Miamisburg said goodbye to old Harmon Field when they played their first high school football game in the brand new stadium in September. Harmon Field has been well used and loved since 1923, but it was finally time to move on. The old field will continue to be used however, for numerous sports events and practice sessions serving the younger grades.

Our new stadium seats over 5,000 and is located on the campus of the high school on Belvo Road, where there is plenty of available parking space. Thanks to the generosity of many businesses,



organizations and private citizens, most of the funds needed to build the new stadium have been raised through the Campus Quest initiative.

We're very proud to report that two of our Society members have been major contributors to this much needed project. The 'Town Center Tour' began at Market Square and encompassed quite a few structures on Main Street,

the Baum Opera House and our Heritage Village. The 'Second Street Tour' included historic buildings on

Second Street, along with the St. Jacob Lutheran Church.
