Acme Bob Sled Donated to the Society

According to David, his father purchased the sled as a young man in the early 1940s. This sled is in pristine condition with the name "Acme Bob" stenciled and the company's metal plate attached.

Who would have guessed that the Acme Boat Co. in Miamisburg, also manufactured bob sleds? The company which was located in the triangular shaped, red brick building by the railroad tracks on Pearl Street, was known nationally and even worldwide for their canvas and wood, folding boats.






Thanks to all who helped or took part in allowing the Society to be represented in this year's parade. It's a great way to publicize our organization and perhaps draw some interest in what we do.

? Did You Know ?

We all know about the Miamisburg Mound and the Adena Native American culture who built it, but did you know there was an additional mound, although an entirely different shape, built right here in Miamisburg? These same Native Americans also built a huge earthwork that completely surrounded their village. That enclosure measured from three to twelve feet high, and up to fifty feet wide at the base.

Can you guess where it was? Yes, it's long gone now, but at one time this mound surrounded what is now our downtown area. It's said to have run from Sycamore Street (or the Ray Bell Bridge), going southward along the river down to about Mays Avenue on the south side of town. It then turned east a couple of blocks, and ran back north, probably between what is now our First and Second Streets. At one time, huge trees and bushes grew on the mound. The clay used in building this mound was used again centuries later, as it went into the making of bricks for the houses and buildings in Miamisburg.

So the next time you're in downtown Miamisburg, think about how you're treading the same steps the Adena walked many centuries ago.

(The Adena culture was prevalent in Ohio from 1,000 BC, well through the second century AD.)

Our Sympathy to the Rettich Family


