Make Your Plans For Memorial Day Weekend 2014

The dates for this year's Memorial Day Weekend are set.

Plan to take advantage of all the events that are offered in our city to honor our military veterans, living and deceased.

The Silver Taps Ceremony will be held at the Market Square Building on Thursday, May 22 at 7:00 pm. This moving ceremony is open to the public and is dedicated to our military veterans and those serving today.

On Saturday, May 24, at 9:00 am, Rocky's 5K Run or Walk for Freedom will start at Library Park. Registration will begin at 8:00 am or you may register online at www.speedy-feet.com.

After the 5K run a **Sign Dedication** will be held, designating State Route 725 from Heincke Rd. to State Route 741, as **Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II Memorial Highway**. Corporal Zanowick, a Miamisburg resident and MHS graduate, was killed in action in Afghanistan on June 3, 2011. The exact time of the dedication will be announced in the near future.

On Saturday evening (May 24) the Victory Dinner/Dance will be held at American Legion Post 165 on Main Street. Dinner will be from 5:00 to 7:00 pm and dancing from 7:30 to 10:00 pm. Tickets are \$10.00 each and will be available at the American Legion Post 165 and the Market Square Building. Music will be provided by the Tom Benner Band. Once you come to this event, you'll be back every year, as both the dinner and the band are top notch!

Welcome Rolla!




February Program Draws Large Crowd



Tornado Damage in 1869 An excerpt from "Miamisburg—The Story of Our Town"





On the bridge, August Urschel and his son were driving their cow home and were caught by ten feet of getting across, but clinging to the side pieces of the end of the bridge, Mr. Urschel is said to have untangled himself and with his son, climbed the abutment to safety, the cow having already escaped.

The roof of the Kauffman Carriage Company was lifted from its walls and carried over the Valley house, once standing on Main Street and then dashed against a dwelling at the corner of Sycamore and Second Streets.

Jacob Zimmer, who lived across the river between the two bridges, described the tornado as "magnificent and perfectly terrible it its fury." "Cows, horses and pigs were unceremoniously hustled along or lifted from their feet," he wrote, "and rolled about in the most undignified manner; and ducks, geese, chickens and other fowls shot through the air with a velocity rarely witnessed. It seems almost incredible that no one was killed and we have every reason to be thankful that the damage and loss of property, comparatively speaking, was so slight."



Pop Quiz Answer

In 2018 Miamisburg will be celebrating its Bicentennial.

1818—2018

On February 20, 1818, four men from Pennsylvania—Emanuel Gebhart, Jacob Kercher, Dr. John and Dr. Peter Treon, offered for sale a large number of lots (90) in a new town by the name of Miamisburg. Said lots being six miles from Franklin and eleven miles from Dayton, and previously known by the name of "Hole's Station".
