Historic Hatfield "Buggyabout" Placed in Safe Storage

Many times we're so busy at the Society that there's not enough room in *The Tavern Log* to report everything we do in a timely manner, so in this issue we're catching up. Late last summer, one of the several historic vehicles owned by the Society was moved into safe storage at the Mound Business Park.

This early auto pictured at right was made here on Main Street in Miamisburg in 1907 by the Hatfield Motor Co. It is thought to be one of only three in existence, and was acquired by the Society in 2008.

Storage of our large historic items is a continuing challenge. Our goal is to eventually have a

museum space where we will be able to share all our historically significant items with the public. Until that goal is achieved, they'll be kept safe, secure and preserved for future generations.

Pictured below are a few more of our larger transportation items that are related to Miamisburg area history.




1918 Willys Overland purchased new in Miamisburg at the White Star Garage.



Our Heritage Village Season Will Open With An Ice Cream Social!

Leave it to Judy Wuerstl and Carolyn Kilpatrick to come up with more great ideas. On opening day of the Heritage Village season (Sun., May 1) there'll be ice cream, cream soda, butter beer and great music for all to enjoy.

The street will be closed off to traffic to allow for a real celebration. The Ice Cream Trolley and Star City Brewing vendors will be set up and serving folks who stop by the Village. Star City Brewing will be serving non-alcoholic "butter beer" and cream soda to go along with ice cream from the Trolley.

It wouldn't be a real celebration without music, and we've got that too. The Vintage Park Band will be doing the honors, and you'll love their sound.

Mark your calendar for May 1. It's right around the corner! The opening day festivities will be from 2:00 to 5:00 pm. Admission is free, but vendors will charge for ice cream and soda. While you're there, be sure and take a tour of the old log buildings and the smokehouse. They'll be all spiffed-up and cleaned, ready for summer season visitors.

Heritage Village (two historic log buildings and smokehouse) is open Sundays, 2:00-5:00 pm, May thru October.

More Great Programs at Market Square

The program on Native Americans originally scheduled for February had to be postponed until another time, but Pastor Joe Getts stepped in and presented a great program and slide show on the history and the progression of funeral customs and the science of embalming in America. In addition to being the current pastor at Trinity Church, Joe Getts for over twenty years, has been a fully licensed funeral director and embalmer, conducting over 3000 funerals and embalming over 11,000 cases. His wonderful presentation style made the subject extremely interesting and enlightening, on a subject that sometimes is not a favorite topic of conversation among people today. As usual at our February program, we were treated to free Ron's Pizza after the presentation.

In March Billy Ring presented his wonderfully entertaining slide show which featured old Miamisburg postcards beginning in the early 1900's. These postcards are from the collection of Ted and Charlene Hiehle and a big thanks goes to them for sharing. For many years, the postage was only a penny and many of the postcards were addressed with only a name and a town and state. No street numbers, or even a street were needed.

The postcard at left shows the intersection of Linden Ave. and Main with traction cars that had been derailed and wrecked during the 1913 flood. These cars would have been completely submerged.

Historical Society's April Program Features Media Production Group

If you have already registered, you will need to re-register every year.



Pop Quiz Answer

The smokehouse was originally built on the farm at the corner of Rts. 741 and 725. The sun-dried bricks of the smokehouse were handcrafted on the property with the help of the last group of Miami Indians in this territory. Originally the Johannes Gebhart farm, the property passed down through the family to Ted and Harriet Hieronymus and their sons, Ted and Lee. When the farm was eventually sold to make room for the expansion of the Dayton Mall area, the family donated the smokehouse to the Historical Society. It was taken down, brick by brick and moved to its present location at Heritage Village, where it was constructed once again.




