Aistoric Research and Resource Committee - HRRC...

The main objective of this committee is to work with the curator to obtain collections and maintain them for the Historical society. This includes research books, microfilm, microfiche, videotapes, CDs and oral interview cassettes for the Research Room, located in the Market Square Building. The Research Room and the Gift Shop are open to the public on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Other resources such as photos, obituaries, house histories and artifacts are stored in the

Archives Room (not open to the public), which is used by volunteers to obtain information for researchers. A knowledgeable historian is available to answer questions about the history of Miamisburg, Miami Township, businesses, homes and much more. If you have something you would like to donate or loan to the society, please contact Joe Steffen, Curator or Nita Petticrew, HRRC Chairperson.

When donations are received, they are not just put in a box! Items are sorted, accessioned (given an identification number) and catalog information is entered into a computerized database for easy access. The items are stored in proper archival containers and file cabinets or shelved in the Research Room. At this time, we are unable to accept personal clothing because we do not have the proper storage area to insure the integrity of the material.

In 2005 over sixty-four donations/collections were received for the Historical Society. Veterans' Uniforms are collected and archived by the Veteran's Committee and are always a welcome donation – please contact Randy Staley or Lester Wead, Jr. if you have Veteran memorabilia.

Congratulations to Carl Becker!

Notes From The Curator

Your Miamisburg Historical Society has received a wonderful gift from Mrs. Phyllis (Holzman) Jackson, formerly of Miamisburg. She has donated Miamisburg City Council Meeting Minutes Ledgers dating from 1838 through 1864. These Minutes date back to pre Civil War days and show in great detail the history of Miamisburg.



We will also be sharing the history of Miamisburg, with the information contained in the old Council Meeting Minutes, in future issues of the Tavern Log. The old Council Meeting Minutes will also be available for research at the Market Square Building.

Following are the Council Meeting Minutes from the January 1, 1861 meeting where the main order of business was the purchase of the first fire engine.

Council Meeting Minutes January 1, 1861

Miamisburg, Ohio **Council Meeting** January 1, 1861

Mayor: C. Boltier

Present: Boltier, Schultz, Goudy, Grove, Kaufman and Meyer. Minutes read and approved.

Special committee on Canal Boat in Basin reported that they had contracted for removal of nuisance and that the work was progressing and would be completed as soon as the weather permits.

Committee on Fire Engine reported with proposition from Mefs Button @ Blake Company and Mep Jeffrees and Company to build an engine.

Mr. Schultz moved that Council now proceed to select from the different proposals and instruct the Committee to order an Engine and that the Committee be continued for that purchase.

Mr. Goudy moved with Kaufman's second that the Committee be authorized to contract with Mefs Button @ Blake Company for a Second Class Engine well furnished.

Mr. Moyer to amend by saying Second Class, less one discharging pipe and spring gears. Original motion amended. Yeas, Moyer, Kaufman, Grove, Goudy and Schultz adopted unanimously.

Mr. Grove moved with Kaufman's second that the Council be authorized to contract with Mefs Button @ Blake Company for a two wheel horse carriage at a cost of \$100.00. Also 500 feet of their double Evetea Hose. Mr. Schultz moved to amend by insisting \$150.00 of hose instead of \$100.00. Motion not accepted.

Mr. Goudy moved that the vote on the awardment be rezoned, he having misunderstood the motion. Motion lost. Mr. Goudy asked for a discussion on the question. Vote yeas Meyers, Kaufman and Schultz. Nays Grove and Goudy. Original motion adopted. Mr. Schultz moved that council proceed to select a name for the Engine and Hose Cart. Mr. Grove suggested the Engine be called "Young America". Mr. Goudy moved to call the Cart "Belle Can".

The following bills were presented: Reuben Gebhart (Fire Company Bill) \$3.32 \$20.95 Reuben Gebhart (Service, Wood, Fluids)

Meeting adjourned: To meet in two weeks



Class Pictures


