Did you ever call 911 for an emergency? Did you wake up from a crisis and find someone taking your blood pressure and helping you to breathe? Did you ever wonder... Who are these people? Your questions will be answered at the Historical Society's April 27, 2017, 7:00 pm Program.

Karen Basso, a former Firefighter-Paramedic is our guest speaker and will share "A Paramedic's Life." Alongside her twenty-five plus year fire career, she also worked as a Registered Nurse in Intensive Care and Emergency Departments of area hospitals. She is an adjunct faculty member for Sinclair Community College where she teaches Fire Science and Allied Health Programs.

"Silver Taps" Memorial Program Planned for May 25






Coins on Display at Market Square





The Stuff of Pirate Treasure





The Bicentennial Planning Committee holds monthly meetings in the Civic Center and citizens are encouraged to attend and learn about areas in which they can take part—a great opportunity for everyone to make a positive impact on our community and create something truly memorable. Your Miamisburg Historical Society is a key player in carrying out our hometown Bicentennial Celebration next year. Join us and help make this a once in a lifetime event.

The theme for the Bicentennial will be "Our Star Is Still Shining," a reference to the City's long-time nickname as "The Star City". While plans are still coming together, several events are already confirmed during the central celebration slated for the week of June 16-23, 2018. An opening parade is set for Saturday, June 16, which coincides with Miamisburg High School Alumni weekend. The Bicentennial Committee and Alumni Association are working together to create combined events and encourage out of town alumni to plan a summer vacation celebrating the city and school.

The opening weekend will also feature "Drums on the Miami" at our Great Adena Mound, an event to celebrate the nearly 3000 years of Early Woodland history of Miamisburg before it became Miamisburg. The week will culminate with a grand performance by the Dayton Philharmonic and a fireworks display over the Great Miami River. The 40-piece philharmonic concert band will be directed by Miamisburg resident Patrick Reynolds and feature the talent of members of the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra.

FUN FACTS ABOUT OHIO

Ohio

The name "Ohio River" was derived from the Iroquois word, "O-Y-O," meaning "great river". The state was named after the river.

Ohio is nicknamed the Buckeye State because of the buckeye trees commonly found in the Ohio River Valley. The buckeye seed looks like the eye of a deer (buck) and hence the name.

The first speeding ticket for an automobile driver was given by a policeman in Dayton, Ohio in 1904, to Harry Myers for going 12 miles per hour on West Third Street.

Ohio is nicknamed the "Mother of Modern Presidents," as the state was the birthplace of eight American presidents: Wm. Henry Harrison, Ulysses S. Grant, Rutherford B. Hayes, James Garfield, Benjamin Harrison, William McKinley, William H. Taft and Warren G. Harding. (Garfield and McKinley were assassinated.)

In the entire state of Ohio in 1895, there were only two cars on the road, and the drivers of these two cars crashed into each other.
