But besides anxiously awaiting Spring and Summer, there are other anxieties we're preoccupied with. Despite our successes in dealing with the Virus. The Virus is still with us. Despite our efforts of returning to normal. Many economic factors are still struggling to recover. Grocery lists are being written. But the grocer's shelves may not have the items in stock. Will work continue or is unemployment just ahead? The products or parts we've ordered and paid for have not yet arrived. Then there is the volatile situation with Ukraine and Russia.

We can be honest! There are many reasons for the anxieties of our times. Unquestionably, fear, concern and worry are looking our way. But which way are we looking?

As we make our journey toward Easter, we are mindful of the victory of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. We can recall the pain and the agonies Jesus experienced on his way to the Cross. Likewise, we know following Jesus Christ does not remove pain, tragedy or sorrow from life. And even though we can recall Christ's words: John 16:33 (NIV) "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." We are aware life can present difficulties.

But candidly, even if there was not a virus. Even if the grocery store shelves were full. Even if Russia posed no threat to Ukraine. Humanly speaking, we could still find ourselves rattled by life's anxieties. I have not mentioned the anxiety of a troubled health. I have not mentioned the anxiety of a broken relationship. I have not mentioned the anxiety of our willingness or our unwillingness to forgive someone who has hurt us. Anxiety would appear! Despite the circumstances!

It is in the Easter account that we find the anxious words of Jesus who cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Yes! Even Jesus experienced the anxiety of his relationship with God the Father. We can see anxiety is real. Anxiety is part of being human. Anxiety can restrict our hope. Anxiety can challenge our faith. And anxiety can rob us of the joy and power of believing.

In looking to the Cross of Jesus Christ we can see Jesus did not experience the anxiety of the Cross alone. Jesus brought his anxiety to the Father. In doing so, Jesus brought all our anxieties to the Father. Once and for all, Jesus laid the anxieties of our humanity before the Father. In doing so Jesus provided the ultimate remedy for fear and anxiety. Jesus countered fear and anxiety with the positive force of love. Jesus restored the brokenness, alienation, fear and worry of anxiety. Anxiety is a broken bond and love is the bond restored. In the love of Jesus Christ, we have the bond of a new relationship with today and our future. Certainly, we don't know "what" will come. But in Christ we know "who" will come. There are many ways and directions we can look and focus our attention. And we will look away for a moment. But remember, Jesus Christ is the goal of history. Before God our Father we should lay our anxieties before him. Our bond with God is no longer broken. The love of Jesus Christ has restored us to God the Father. Amen.


