

VOMASTEK WHISKEY CAKE —A Tradition at our WSSC Christmas Parties.

The Vomastek Family has provided their famous Whiskey Cake at the annual WSSC Christmas Parties for years. This started with Chuck Sr. and his wife Corine, and now this year the cake was baked by Chuck Jr.

Of course wife and mother Corine Vomastek should get all of the credit for starting this lovely tradition.

The Vomastek Family (through Chuck Jr.) has graciously agreed to share their recipe for this cake.

We thank them for this, and we will always think of the Vomastek Family whenever we bake or eat the famous Vomastek Whiskey Cake

Whiskey Cake Recipe

Grease and flour a 10" angel food cake pan. Place Maraschino cherry halves cut-side down in bottom of pan. Heat oven to 350°.

Beat 4 eggs well

Add 1 cup of milk

Add ½ cup Crisco oil – beat well

Add 1 pkg. Toasted Coconut instant pudding (Royal) or Vanilla instant pudding 3 oz.

Add 1 pkg. Duncan Hines Pineapple cake mix

Optional – Fold in 1 cup of nuts

Bake 50 – 55 minutes

When cake is about ready to take out:

Melt 1 stick of butter

Add ½ cup of sugar

Add 1/2 cup of whiskey

Bring this to a quick boil and remove cake from oven. Poke holes in top of cake with toothpick. Spoon 1/2 whiskey mix over hot cake in pan. Wait 15 minutes and remove cake from pan. Spoon remainder of whiskey mix over bottom of cake.
