THE E. REED REPORT Weed to be Legal in Illinois

The Illinois Senate and House of Representatives has approved a bill which Governor Pritzker has agreed to sign into law which legalizes cannabis (Marijuana) use and possession for those over the age of 21. The new law will take effect January 1, 2020.

The House voted 66-47 to pass the measure which essentially legalizes recreational marijuana. A private citizen may possess 30 grams of cannabis flower (a big bag of weed), 5 grams of cannabis concentrate (Marijuana Oils), or 500 milligrams of THC contained in a cannabis-infused product (example, topicals and food-laced products like weed-brownies).

State Senator Jacqueline Collins said that, "This is a step toward justice in the wake of the destructive War on Drugs."

Many people see the war on drugs, initiated by the Reagan Administration, as a war on Black and Brown people with a devastating result of seeing historic numbers of African American men incarcerated and their economic and social lives inex-

tricably damaged due to minor drug offenses.

In addition to legalization, House Bill 1438 takes a wide-ranging approach to vacating past convictions for drug offenses and ensuring participation in the legal cannabis market for minorities seeking to invest in it.

"With this major move to vacate non-violent offenses and a dedicated program to help minority communities invest in a legalized industry, this is a true step toward justice in the wake of the destructive War on Drugs," Collins said. "As we seek to bring an end to an illicit market and give rise to a legal one, I'm dedicated to fighting for equity for communities of color that have been devastated by punitive drug policy."

"This will have a transformational impact on our state, creating opportunity in the communities that need it the most and giving so many a second chance ... In the interest of equity and criminal-justice reform, I look forward to signing this monumental legislation," Governor J. B. Pritzker said in a tweet once it passed the Illinois House of Representatives.

The Social Equity Program (part of House Bill 1438) will help to promote minority involvement in the cannabis industry, giving participants access to grants and loans in order to deter some of the upfront costs of participating in the market.

The Recover, Reinvest and Renew Program (R3) would provide incentive funding for high-need, underserved communities throughout the state, and provide planning and implementation of grants and technical assistance to collaborative groups and civil legal aids to people in R3 areas.

The plan also seeks to expunge non-violent offenses. Convictions of possession of no more than 30 grams of cannabis will be dealt with automatically through the governor's clemency process, and a process to petition courts to vacate other convictions for non-violent cannabis-related offenses will be put in place.

There is strong law-enforcement opposition to legalizing recreational marijuana. The religious community has been relatively silent. Most religious leaders are in opposition, but torn by the adversarial impact of the War on Drugs on the community.

The question is, "Is this a good thing, and what will be the long-term social impacts?" As the old folks will say, "Time will tell".

This is a growing trend. Thirty-three (33) states have legalized medical marijuana and about five states have either passed legislation legalizing recreational marijuana or have pending legislation on their dockets like Illinois.

TODAY'S CHALLENGES TO OVERCOMING POVERTY

A healthy economy built for long-term sustainability requires that businesses have access to skilled workers, communities have a broad base of contributing taxpayers, and individuals have sufficient income to both support their families and contribute to a robust marketplace. Moreover, children raised in households that are stable economically are far more likely to have better health, higher school achievement levels, and more⁴ long-term job prospects. For all of these reasons, it has never been more important to find a way to break the cycle of poverty. Yet our methods for doing so have not changed significantly since the War on Poverty in the 1960s, and disparities in opportunity caused by poverty continue to increase. Finding a way to remove the obstacles that prevent people from escaping poverty today is a much more complicated process than it was in the past. The buying power of the federal minimum wage has been eroded by more than 30 percent since the 1960s. Changes in US public policy have resulted in drastic cuts in public benefits and training programs for the poor. More than 1 in 5 children in the US live in poverty, and the child poverty rate has increased nearly 35 percent since 2000. (Children's Defense Fund, 2012).² the shift from an industrial to a knowledge-based economy has meant that virtually all jobs paying a family-sustaining wage require post-secondary education. To get ahead, low-income, single parents often face the formidable task of caring for and supporting their children while obtaining the education and training necessary to qualify for higher-paying jobs. At the same time, the public benefits necessary to supplement their low wages and help them transition to economic independence continue to shrink. In this context, "economic independence" is defined as being able to achieve a fair standard for housing, health care, nutrition, and child care while avoiding dependence on public income or work supports such as subsidized housing or nutrition assistance. Recognizing that this is a high standard to achieve for many low-income families, it is nevertheless an important goal to aim towards. In order to attain this standard of living, low-income families must navigate complicated challenges for years because there are no short-term career paths to the family-sustaining jobs of today. However, as much as the conditions for overcoming poverty have changed over the past 50 years, most public policies and programs are still designed to help poor adults become employed as quickly as possible in jobs assumed to pay enough to support a family along with minimal public benefits. This straight forward road map to employment worked effectively when well-paid, unskilled jobs were abundant and public benefits, such as affordable housing and child care, were better funded. To attain the higher-skilled, well-paying jobs of today's knowledge-based economy, adults need enhanced strategic-thinking skills to guide them through the innumerable decisions and trade-offs required in the complicated journey to economic independence. Community Action will continue to look at ways to address these concerns. Helping People. Changing Lives.

In a way, you can say that Donald Trump started it all. Brandon has always had an interest in community engagement. His step-mother was an administrator in the Waukegan Public School District and his father, a business professional, was an active member of the Waukegan Community Church. He saw his parents work to help others, and he saw them as great examples of positive leadership.

It was election night, Tuesday, November 7, 2017, the night that Donald Trump was elected President of the United States that Brandon says that it was time for him to step up to the plate and be a positive force within his community. He had seen some things go wrong locally and nationally, so instead of joining the ranks of complainers, he decided that it was time for him to get off the sidelines and do something about it. He would run for the school board.

To his surprise, he was well received, as he had already gained a lot of momentum by prior community involvement.

“I was the events and public relations coordinator at Peoples Choice Family Fun Center and in that role, I worked very closely with Waukegan Public Schools and I got to know a lot of the teachers and principals and had the opportunity to start a mentoring group called men of vision which was the same group that I was involved in at CLC,” says Brandon Ewing.

At the College of Lake County, where Brandon earned his associate degree, Ewing was involved in a men’s mentoring group known as Men of Vision. He brought that strategy of helping young men to the public school and began to mentor youth there.

Ewing gives a lot of credit to whom he calls his mentor and former teacher, Mr. Chuck Gutman. Mr. Gutman ran the Men of Vision program for two years and was a big supporter of our students and I wanted to honor his legacy by continuing to fight for our students. Mr. Gutman was a guidance counselor and a coordinator for AVID, a college prep program.

Brandon's next career move was to Baxter Credit Union where he became the a Certified Goal Consultant – providing credit repair consultation, and financial budgeting and planning. He also holds a NMLS License which allows him to do mortgages. He is now the assistant branch manager in the Vernon Hills Office.

Ewing says that as President of the Waukegan Public School District, that his number one goal is to implement the Board of Education's Destination 2022 Strategy.

"The district has a strategic plan that is designed to help transform our district, and allow our students to succeed," Brandon said. "As the board president, I will work with the rest of the board team to ensure that we meet the goals and metrics laid out in that strategic plan. An additional goal is to restore faith in the district. And to let the community know that the Waukegan School Board is there for them."

Shortly after the last school board election, Brandon was named President of the Board, elected by his peer board members.

He said that many of the Destination 2022 Strategic Initiatives will directly improve the welfare of students. For example, they hope to improve the graduation rate by at least 90%. Currently it hovers between 75 to 78%. This means that of the cohort of students who enter the ninth grade, only about 78% actually graduate.

Brandon is the founder of Fathers Matter, an online Facebook page that promotes positive images of fathers and encourages fatherhood. The page has over 60,000 followers.

In addition to his work on the school board, Ewing is an active member of the #JustDOIt_Vote Coalition which is helping to get millennials engaged in the political process.

"The #JustDOItVote Coalition is a group of people working together. We see the gap of millennials engaged in our community, and we feel that it is important to include millennials in the process," Ewing said. The group meets quarterly.

He also hosts a facebook live show, Real Talk Live with Brandon Ewing.

Brandon Ewing, 28, is married to Monique and the couple have three children.

Head Start Wraps Up Its 1st Year with STEAM

What is preschool STEAM? The term STEM was developed by the National Science Foundation in the early 2000's as an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. 
