





# Jesse Jackson Turns 80 Renews Call for Social Justice

After two presidential runs, international prisoner negotiations, freedom marches and local organizing, the Rev. Jesse Jackson is still fighting for what he believes is right as he turns 80.

At a birthday celebration at Rainbow/PUSH Friday, Jackson gave a call to action on a number of social justice issues he believes is threatening “all we’ve gained in the last 50 years.”

“We’re in a critical situation,” Jackson said. “We must now organize a different paradigm, a different disposition.”

Jackson, who only weeks ago finished treatment for COVID and Parkinson’s disease, was joined by pastors and leaders from around Chicago who said prayers for the civil rights icon and recalled his marked influence in civil rights history.

Jackson reflected on his 1984 talks with Fidel Castro, which led to the release of 48 political prisoners, as well as his 1990 meeting with Nelson Mandela after the world leader’s release from prison. “The harder you work, the luckier you get,” he said. “I’ve never seen that fail.”

Two weeks earlier, Jackson was released from a Chicago rehabilitation center after an intense battle with COVID and receiving treatment for Parkinson’s. Jackson, who was vaccinated at the time, said the vaccine saved his life and encouraged others in the Black community to get the jab.

“I could not walk nor talk for three weeks,” Jackson said. “I went to rehab so I could learn how to walk or talk again. You need to know that, God, the shots matter.”

Jackson also emphasized the importance of fighting for federal voting protections and decried how “state’s rights” has made it harder for many to vote in the South.

“Registration. Vaccination. Education,” Jackson repeated. “We must get registered to vote, and we must get vaccinated.”

He compared the recent anti-abortion measures to America’s own “taliban.”

The event was held at Jackson’s Rainbow/PUSH organization, which he founded in 1971 after a falling out with fellow civil rights activist

Ralph Abernathy during their work on Operation Breadbasket. Today the organization works to fight for social justice and provide economic support to minority communities.

Jackson’s son, Jonathan Jackson, said it’s imperative that his father’s work to fight for social justice continues today.

“My father says, ‘The struggle is then and the struggle is now,’” Jonathan said. “We must be more focused and exacting in our conversations.... It’s not the water fountain anymore. It’s not the segregated schools anymore.”

Theological students from Ghana, Kenya and India also gathered to thank the religious leader and civil rights paragon for his global influence.

“Your work is a great inspiration to the entire world,” said Christopher Rajkumar, from India. “Continue to inspire us.”

# North Point Casino Seeks To Open Temporary Casino

(WAUKEGAN, Illinois) – The North Point Casino development group, one of two finalists to build a casino in Waukegan, Illinois presented its inclusive, locally focused development plan to the Illinois Gaming Board (IGB) in mid-October. The presentation highlighted the group’s commitment to diversity, lifting local partners and organized labor, opening a temporary casino rapidly at a property the group has secured, and its commitment to giving back to Waukegan, which is evident by its charitable contributions over the past two years.

“First and foremost, the entire North Point Casino team, including our ownership group and local partners, thanks the Illinois Gaming Board



for the privilege to share our vision of an inclusive, world-class, entertainment destination for Waukegan and the State of Illinois,” said Bill Warner, CEO of Warner Gaming, which is the proposed developer and operator of North Point Casino. “Over the past two years, our careful planning has allowed us to secure a temporary casino site across the street from Fountain Square, deepen our relationships with local vendors, suppliers, and organized labor, and become

more engrained within Waukegan through various philanthropic efforts. We respectfully ask the Illinois Gaming Board to choose the North Point Casino group to build Waukegan’s casino.”

During the presentation, North Point Casino highlighted the following areas which make it the best choice for Waukegan.

## North Point Casino *story continued...*

North Point Casino decided to partner with local restaurant operators to offer dining options in the facility ensuring they share in the casino's success. These local partners include Quonset Pizza, Big Ed's BBQ, Austin's and La Canoa.

Warner Gaming specializes in developing entertainment destinations that complement existing community resources – not compete with them. Much like what Warner Gaming achieved in Sioux City, Iowa, with the Hard Rock Casino and their working relationship with the Orpheum Theatre, North Point Casino's outdoor amphitheater will attract shows and entertainment that do not compete with the Genesee Theatre in Waukegan.

North Point Casino introduced its entire proposed ownership group during the IGB presentation, which is comprised of 30% minority and 25% female investors – exceeding state requirements. Of the newest investors joining the group, 50% are military veterans.

In addition to the original investors, which includes Bill Warner and Warner Gaming, Michael Bond, Jeff Parr and Clairvest Group, and Prashant Gupta, North Point Casino has added Charles Smith, Founder and CEO of CS Investment Strategies and Chairman of the Business Leadership Council, Pamela Netzky, Co-Founder of SkinnyPop Popcorn and Amplify Snack Brands, Adam Velarde, Founder and CEO of Cave Enterprises, Cesar Velarde, an Illinois attorney, Gloria and Steve ForUs, owners and operators of Diverse Solutions Group, Bryce Bowman, CEO and managing partner of People 1st Advisors and Morgan Mann, Chief Operating Officer, Security Business Group at Cisco.

“North Point has been very keenly aware of what it takes to actually value diversity. Diversity doesn't just mean black or white or Asian or Hispanic – it is really about much more,” said Charles Smith, a North Point Casino partner, founder and CEO of CS Investment Strategies and Chairman of the Business Leadership Council. “Diversity also includes age, gender, LGBTQ, veterans – characteristics and life experiences that contribute to a diversity of thought and opinion across all lines. North Point has been very inclusive of all those thoughts. Not only does our commitment set us apart, but a diverse ownership group will be our biggest asset in terms of achieving success.”

In addition to the most diverse ownership group, North Point Casino is the only finalist with the backing of the Black Chamber of Commerce of Lake County, which will advise North Point on recruiting a diverse workforce. Furthermore, North Point Casino is requiring its general contractor to mentor a local minority-owned contracting firm in every aspect

of construction.

North Point Casino announced it has executed an option to lease a temporary casino at 300 Lakehurst Road in Waukegan, across the street from the proposed future home of the permanent North Point Casino at Fountain Square.

In addition, the building owner, working in tandem with North Point Casino, has demolition permits in-hand to begin work on the build-out should North Point Casino be awarded the license by the IGB. The lease option and readiness to begin the temporary casino build-out means North Point Casino will be able to rapidly open a temporary casino – which will create local jobs, begin producing revenue for the city, county and state, and spur economic development rapidly.

North Point's temporary casino and permanent casino will be built with local union labor and will feature food and dining offerings from local restaurant partners. The proposed 60,000 square foot temporary casino would include 850 slots, table games, a sportsbook, and dining.

“On behalf of the Lake County building trades, we support the North Point Casino,” said Pete Olson, President of the Lake County Building and Construction Trades Council. “I have no doubt that they are a locally focused developer who will share their success with local working families and local small businesses.”

In the two years since North Point Casino was advanced to the IGB by the Waukegan City Council, the group has been active in supporting local charitable causes – a clear indicator of its commitment to the community. Contributions made by North Point Casino since 2019 include:


They are often referred to as the Action Jackson brothers, George Jackson Jr. 85, and Willie Jackson, 89, were inducted into the North Chicago Senior Citizen's Hall of Fame on October 15, 2021 during a ceremony at City Hall. The Jackson Brothers were recognized for a number of community service accomplishments, as well as dedication to their church and family.

George Jackson Jr., a resident of North Chicago for 62 years, was employed with US Steel for 20 years and with Great Lakes 15 years and with the VA hospital for 10 years part time. He served on various boards and commission in North Chicago including the Emergency Service Disaster Association, Weather Watch organization, and the Citizen/Police organization.

Willie Jackson, 89, has lived in the city of North Chicago for 70 years. He served in the United States Airforce for 16 years and in the United States Army Reserves for 10 years. He was employed with the Great Lakes Fire Department for 20 years. Some of his civic leadership services included serving on the Civil Defense committee for the city of North Chicago and as a team member of the Christian Faith Fellowship Church food pantry organization.





## Pritzker Approve Vaccine For Children

With nearly 6.2 million children nationwide testing positive for COVID-19 since the start of the pandemic, Governor JB Pritzker outlined the coordinated statewide efforts to prepare for the anticipated approval of the Pfizer vaccine for children ages 5-11.

The governor announced the administration is partnering with pediatricians, local health departments, schools, and other organizations ahead of the expected emergency-use authorization from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Federal Drug Administration (FDA). Once the Pfizer vaccine is authorized for use in children, more than 2,200 locations and providers statewide. Overall, the initial allocation will amount to approximately 500,000 doses available to children in Illinois.

“As soon as the FDA and the CDC have signed off, these kid-sized doses and kid-sized needles will be shipped out to pharmacies, pediatricians, and other providers across Illinois. As a parent, you should call your pediatrician to make sure they’ve enrolled and have ordered doses,” said Governor Pritzker.
