


It was a first time meeting in person for some of the influencers, and it was an opportunity to create new relationships, and for some to refresh existing ones. Several community-based issues were discussed.

Seniors May Now Use Ride Lake County

Ride Lake County, a borderless, county-wide paratransit service that provides transportation to anywhere in Lake County for seniors ages 60+ and people with disabilities.

Before scheduling their first ride, residents must register through Pace by calling their call center at 1-800-201-6446. Residents can register as either a senior (60+) or as an individual with a disability:

The Pace Call Center will ask for an *RTA Reduced Fare Permit number for residents registering as an individual with a disability

For riders registering as an individual with a disability, Riders registering as an individual with a disability can either provide proof of disability benefits or have their doctor fill out a proof of disability form to obtain the Reduced Fare Permit.

Riders can apply for the Reduced Fare Permit in the following ways:

Online at fares.rtachicago.org

- 1) In-person at one of the RTA's local offices.
- 2) Please call 312-913-3110 to find the RTA office located nearest to you to fill out an application.
- 3) By mail or downloading application. application from the RTA website and mailing to the address listed on the application

Residents can call the Pace Call Center at 1-800-201-6446 daily between 5:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. to book a trip.

Riders can schedule a trip any day of the week from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. with the exception of certain holidays. Riders can reserve a trip as far as seven days in advance or as little as two hours in advance.



Ride Lake County is sponsored by Lake County and Pace Suburban Bus. The service is funded in part by grants from the Regional Transportation Authority. Local matching funds for these federal grants are provided by Lake County.



The Story of Love, Inc.

Yes, that is right. The name of this not-for-profit is Love, Inc. It's a helps ministry that directly supports a collaborative of churches in the region. Some call it a Gap Ministry where churches refer their members or individuals being ministered to for critical items that they might need in a time of crisis.

The help may include furniture, household items, beds and bedding, as well as clothes and cribs for the children. The mission of the organization is to mobilize local churches to transform lives and communities In the Name of Christ.

An example might be that a church member has a fire and gets burned out. The family has low income with little or no insurance. An affiliated church will refer the family to Love inc. Love Inc., who maintains a warehouse, will fulfill the physical needs to help get that family back on track.

But that's not all that there is to this story.

"We exist to improve the quality of life for people in the community," says Barb Poynter, Director of the New Hope Ministry component of Love Inc.

Poynter says that New Hope Ministry offers classes on Faith and Finance which includes training on budgeting, saving and credit. They also have Affirmation Classes where they help people realize their potential.

Poynter says that she became involved in the New Hope ministry and was helped by the training classes and the supportive atmosphere at the organization.

"We train on trauma, how to help people help people who are hurting," says Gary Garland, Love Inc., Executive Director.

Garland explains that through their work. "We help to bring the kingdom closer to earth."

There is a true story of a family that Love Inc. helped. There was a young lady who had two children and due to circumstances beyond her control, she was living in her car, with the children, and working as a door dash delivery person. There were nights that she slept in the care with the motor running so that she and her children would not freeze to death.

The Pastor of Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church discovered her situation and referred her to Love Inc. The organization connected her with community and government resources to secure an apartment, partner churches provided beds, Christmas gifts for the children, and coats for the entire family.

While needing the help, Candice says that initially she was reluctant to accept the food and household items, but one of her mentors at Love Inc, built a trusting relationship, encouraging, and mentoring her. Candice says that she learned that sometimes you have to swallow your pride and, "You have to let God be in charge of your life."

According to Garland, Love Inc. operates on the Redemptive Compassion biblical philosophy which is a holistic approach to ministry with the following six core principles:

- 1. Everyone has value
- 2. We are called to invest relationally in each other
- 3. Everyone has capacity and potential
- 4. Mutual participation is important
- 5. We must use wisdom and discernment
- 6. What we do should transform

Love Inc. is a nationally recognized organization. In Lake County they have 80 churches that are engaged in the ministry with 500 volunteers who give over 20,000 hours of volunteer time each year.

CREED III

Movie Review

I went to see Creed III with less than high expectations. Another boxing film? Another in the Sylvester Stallone Rocky Franchise? How long will they milk this one? But due to the dearth of black films, I went anyway. The film knocked me out. The picture was so viscerally appealing, with a solid story line, that within minutes, I was drawn in and captivated throughout the flick.

With core characters conceived by Sylvester Stallone and written by Ryan Coogler, the story finds Adonis Creed, the son of Apollo Creed, on top of the world as a boxing promoter and former Heavy Weight Champion of the World. He is married with a deaf child and is managing the current Heavy Weight World Champ. Amid his opulent life, his past comes back to haunt him. He was party to a violent attack, and left his boxing best friend to take the fall, including 15 years in the penitentiary.

When his friend, Damien Anderson, gets out, he pays Adonis a visit demanding to have an opportunity that jail time took away from him. He wants to get a chance to fight for the Heavy Weight Championship. Damien stacks the deck in his favor by having a jail house frat attack and take out the contender against the current champ forcing Adonis to put him in.

It was after the bout, that Adonis (Micheal B. Jordon) discovers that he had been played and that his child hood friend had set him up.

He must now fight Damien



to take back the title and his integrity. Phylicia Rashad shines as Adonis Creed's mother, and the discoverer of Damien's scheme. Tessa Thompson sparkles as Adonis's wife and Johnathan Major surprises as an authentic Heavy Weight, with heavy weight acting that was so compelling that even while he is the unrighteous antagonist, the audience is compelled to have veiled sympathy.

And while the end was predictable, it was entertaining to watch. Michael B Jordon did an excellent job directing, including directing himself with the film grossing more than \$250 million its opening weekend.





Since the start of the pandemic, DCEO has provided more than \$535 million to more than 15,000 businesses through the B2B and Business Interruption Grant Programs. The program design is based on legislation

establishing the Restaurant Employment and Stabilization Grant Program (\$50 million), Hotel Jobs Recovery Grant Program (\$75 million), and the Illinois Creative Recovery Grant program (\$50 million).


