

Trailblazing Park Director, Retires

Waukegan Park District Executive Director Greg Petry retires on Friday, June 30 after thirty years of dedicated service.

Initially hired as Superintendent of Parks in 1987, Greg Petry was promoted to Executive Director in 1995. Greg's leadership and focus on excellence brought the Waukegan Park District national acclaim with its Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA) accreditation in 2012 and the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) Gold Medal Award in 2013. There are only four other Illinois park districts that claim that achievement.

"Greg Petry is a master at planning and implementing operational systems that support goals and accountability. Over the years, the district flourished due to a referendum that generates more than three million annually for capital improvements. The combination of revenue and the district's strong commitment to the community, fiscal responsibility and collaboration with the City of Waukegan for developer land dedication created 10 new parks; signature facilities-the Field House Sports, Fitness and Aquatics Center, the Waukegan SportsPark, Bowen Playground and

Waukegan BMX Track; and a park system with open spaces, recreational facilities, programs and services that are used by our diverse community and its neighbors. Thank you, Greg for your vision, leadership and dedication! You are leaving the District at the top of your game." said George Bridges, Waukegan Park District President.

Greg Petry developed partnerships with other organizations which extended services providing the community with the best service for the greatest value. Gateway facilities, the Waukegan SportsPark and the Field House Sports, Fitness and Aquatics Center not only serve Waukegan residents; both attract regional and national athletic tournaments generating more than \$15 million annually in economic benefit to the area economy, especially hotels and restaurants.

Greg has been recognized for his distinguished service by the Illinois Park and Recreation Association (IPRA) with the Robert Artz Lifetime Achievement Award in 2012 and by the Illinois Association of Park Districts (IAPD) with the Honored Professional Award in 2016. He served on the Illinois Parks and Recreation Board (IPRA) representing the metro region, he was a member of the Joint IAPD/IPRA Legislative Committee organizing breakfasts with legislators and park district leaders throughout Illinois. Illinois Legislative Black Caucus Awards \$65K in Scholarships

The Illinois Legislative Black Caucus Foundation (ILBCF) awarded 65 deserving young women and men \$1,000 stipends to attend various colleges and universities throughout the country.

Since the scholarship fund was established in 2005, the ILBCF has awarded over \$400,000 to deserving students whose goal is to matriculate to a college or university of their choice. Recipients live in various communities throughout Illinois, from Waukegan to East St. Louis. Funding for the scholarships come from various corporate sponsors and individual donations.

"Our budget situation has put some students behind and forced several thousands to drop out of college," said Assistant Majority Leader Kimberly A. Lightford, Joint Chairman of the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus. "It's a shame that there are groups within government who feel college assistance is a luxury."



In Northern Illinois, especially in the North Chicago, Waukegan and Round Lake areas, severe storms brought heavy rains which caused millions of dollars in damages to homes, business and schools. In Round Lake, the Round Lake Area Elementary School suffered about \$3.5 millions in damages to three schools.

According, Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Constance Collins, they are working hard to repair the damage and get schools open in time for the fall.

Governor Bruce Rauner came out and toured the damaged schools to see first-hand the devastation.

The Lake County Emergency management system coordinated with area charitable organizations relief efforts supplying residents with cleaning supplies, food, meals, and help with filing flood insurance.

The City of North Chicago sent out a voice mail alert directing residents on how to get assistance. They also held a free pick-up of tons of water damaged goods that residents had to dispose. The community came together to provide to residents impacted by the flood with assistance.

PROTECTING HOUSEHOLD ENERGY RESOURCES

For decades, the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) and Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) have collaborated to reduce energy burden for low-income and vulnerable families, and to improve the energy efficiency and health; and safety of households served.

In order to protect the federal funding that supports these programs, it is important to understand how each benefits the communities served.

Reducing Energy Burden

- Families with low incomes on average pay 16.3% of total family income towards home energy costs compared to 3.5% for other families. In some circumstances, energy burden can reach up to 30% of total family income. The average LIHEAP household earns about \$17,000 annually.

- At least 70% of households served have at least one family member who is elderly, disabled, or a family with a child younger than six years old.

- Since its inception, WAP has weatherized more than 7.4 million homes nationwide.

- Weatherization returns \$1.72 in energy savings benefits for every \$1.00 invested and saves families an average of \$283 each year on energy costs. In our area, WAP can reduce heating costs by up to 30%.

Ensuring Health & Safety

- Low income families facing

high energy costs are forced to make budget tradeoffs between medical

care and utilities that can jeopardize health. When faced with a shut-off, families are sometimes forced to resort to unsafe methods of moderating the temperature in their homes.

- LIHEAP protects the health and safety of families by ensuring continued utility service for families in crisis, preventing health-related repercussions that can result in death, including hypothermia and heat stroke.

- Residents of weatherized homes experienced decreased asthma and allergy symptoms, faced fewer hospitalizations, and reported better overall health. They also reported fewer missed days of work and fewer school absences.

Energy is a life-critical resource. These programs preserve the dignity of those living in poverty and assure access to basic energy resources for all Lake County residents. Access to affordable home energy is a matter of health and safety for many low-income households, children, veterans, and seniors. LIHEAP and WAP have traditionally appreciated bipartisan support, and we hope that Congress will prioritize funding for both programs in fiscal year 2018.

North Chicago Hosts Summer Youth Program

The City of North Chicago's Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) is unlike most summer job opportunities available to North Chicago teens. The city operates separate programs to provide paths for 26 North Chicago youth who self-select a summer job within municipal services. This year's program includes training and hands-on experience for future firefighters/paramedics, streets department, human resources, information technology, communications and water plant operators through its Operator in Training Program. "Through our summer employment program, the City of North Chicago has the opportunity to connect the work of the youth with their future professional success," said Mayor Rockingham.

The structured program offers both employment and professional development skills. In addition to working 25 hours a week, SYEP participants attend weekly sessions that cover financial responsibility, skill building exercises, CPR and first aid certification, career

opportunities in the field of science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics (STEAM) and field trips to the Federal Reserve Bank and Fermilab. To staff the summer positions, the City of North Chicago works with Lake County Workforce Development who provides non-technical employees while other students and program funding are found through collaborations with North Chicago Community High School, the Steans Family Foundation and Darrell King, founder of the Operator in Training Program.

Daniel Hartman

Leads the Mosaic Movement at Trinity International University

Daniel Hartman enters the room showing a bright smile and quiet confidence. In casual conversation, it becomes clear quickly that this man has only a passing interest in last night's game, the weather, or his plans for the month.

Mention the word Mosaic, and his face lights up.

Mosaic is a campus group at Trinity International University deeply connected with churches and challenges in northern Lake County.

"I think a lot of it flows from love," Hartman says, "trying to love God, and love others. And when you look at the way society is set up -- especially in northern Lake County -- you see a lot of social divisions and boundaries that aren't pleasing to God."

Mosaic formed at Trinity in 2008, as students from a variety of backgrounds on the Deerfield campus expressed interest in creating a spiritual formation group focused on the biblical calling of reconciliation. One of those students was Daniel Hartman.

After graduation, Hartman became coordinator of Mosaic in 2011. In the nearly 10 years since the group's first meeting, Mosaic has established a multi-pronged ministry in northern Lake County.

For example, the Mosaic Church Network brings together congregations that are African American, Latino, and multi-racial, as well as additional church groups committed to spanning the divides of race and socio-economic class.

Mosaic Partnerships, a mutually beneficial collaborative effort to create service opportunities for Trinity students and mentoring and speaking opportunities for northern Lake County leaders, has influenced many lives for God's Kingdom.

A third Mosaic ministry attracted Hartman's daily participation. Mosaic House in North Chicago is a place where single men live and pray together, opening their living space to ministry opportunities in the neighborhood.



"We meet each morning for prayer, and every Monday night, we have a community dinner and prayer time," Hartman says. "All are welcome to come in to pray and then to eat together. Wednesdays we have Bible studies, and sometimes youth from the high school come out to it."

Hartman lived in Mosaic House for seven years. Upon getting married, he and his wife, Nicole, moved down the street, and current residents Kevin Deming and Josh Brown assumed more leadership of its day-to-day ministry.

Hartman earned his Master of Divinity at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in 2011, but his previous schooling was in a very different field. He earned a biomedical engineering degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and worked in Clinical Research Services at Kimberly-Clark for four years.

A grant from the Lilly Endowment will put Hartman in the midst of much different research in the next four years.

The grant focuses on young adults who are absent in church life. “When we talk with pastors, we see one of the big missing demographics in many churches is 20-somethings,” Hartman says. “We feel that this ministry is divinely timed and are excited to see the church reaching more young adults for Christ.”

The work will focus on 12 congregations in northern Lake County, where the pattern still is relatively new.

“What we’re seeing now is really significant,” Hartman says. “We are seeing our young people participating in social movements outside of the church.”

“I think that’s a significant struggle,” Hartman continues. “We want to see if the concerns that many of these young people voice can be most effectively addressed through the church with the Gospel.”

A strong relationship with local pastors is what he ranks among his deepest blessings.

“College education in the community at an affordable rate has been what many of the pastors have asked for,” Hartman says. “Out of the collaboration with pastors as well as faculty and administrators at Trinity, some new initiatives have come up.”

Trinity’s Certificate in Christian Ministries program meets at the University Center of Lake County in downtown Waukegan. Students take five courses (each of which meet six times) and complete the certificate in just more than a year’s time at a deeply discounted tuition rate.

For those who want a bachelor’s degree, Trinity offers a program for adults that includes eight programs of study, of which four are available 100% online.

Hartman sees both programs as an answer to prayer – and he prays regularly that more students in the area will participate in these opportunities to be equipped for God’s work.

“I want to participate in God’s redemptive work, to see healing and wholeness,” Hartman says. “We want to see the full church of God thrive – and in a way God’s called us to do.”

Egg Omelet with Avocado

Eggs are just about the best source of protein on the planet. Egg yolks are one of the richest dietary sources that helps prevent fat and cholesterol from accumulating in the liver. Serve with avocado for a nice dose of fiber and monounsaturated fat.

It's an almost perfect meal. You can add a little flaxseed oil (or olive oil or butter) to the sweet potato or even sprinkle it with almonds, but watch your portion size

(You can of course make the shake with milk, but watch out for the calories.) Whey Isolate is the best protein to purchase. One, it is simply a purer protein than concentrate. That means that for every scoop you take, you are getting more actual protein and less of anything else i.e. sugar and fat. Two, it is lower in carbs and who needs more carbs in their diet?
