The North Chicago School District held an official a ground breaking for a new Neal Math and Science Academy as a junior high school for North Chicago on May 6, 2021.

Area dignitaries including the Mayor of the City of North Chicago and School Superintendent John Price attended the ceremony which kicked off the \$40 million redevelopment of the school site located on the corner of Argonne and Lewis in North Chicago. Abbvie was the major contributor to funding the construction as a part of their global reinvestment and philanthropic strategy. Claudia Carravetta, Vice President of Corporation re-

sponsibility and Global Philanthropy of AbbVie was on hand at the Ground Breaking.

“I believe the new Neal will show that we can do BIG things in our community and we care about our school and our entire community,” says Patience Cager, an eighth grader from the school said in a prepared speech during the occasion.

The new school is anticipated to be open for business with the Fall 2022 school year.





James Sisson Passes

Choir Director and Founder of the Mass Community Choir, The Chosen Ones, James Sisson has died. Sisson will be remembered as a husband, a brother, and a friend my hundreds of whom he helped in a number of ways. On Saturday May 1, the community came together for a ballon release in his honor. Sisson was 54.

Roycealee J. Wood Retires

Roycealee Wood, Lake County's regional superintendent of schools, ended an educational career spanning more than 50 years in the midst of her fifth term because of a severe case of COVID-19. Wood's resignation was communicated in April by a letter to Lake County Board Chair Sandy Hart, indicating her recovery from a prolonged hospitalization made it impossible to continue.

At a special meeting of the Lake County Board, Dr. Micheal Karner was appointed to replace Roycealee Wood as Superintendent of Schools for Lake County.

Donna Johnson, First African American Mayor of Libertyville

Donna Johnson, made history this spring, she was elected Mayor of the City of Libertyville. Donna, a trustee of the village, ran for the position unopposed. She is the first African American Mayor of Libertyville and the third African American Mayor of a city in Lake County, Illinois.

Help with Rent?

If you are looking for help with Covid-19 such as rental assistance, getting scheduled for a vaccine and other services there are a number of organizations that can help. The African American Community Partnership Group is providing scheduling services for vaccines, The NAACP is providing resource navigation services, and the Community Action Partnership is providing food, scheduling for vaccines, and rental assistance. You may contact any of these organizations for help.

There is another organization that is specializing in rental assistance for Landlords and tenants. It is being administered by the Community Partners for Affordable Housing

They have two programs, one for Landlords seeking rent for their tenants impacted by Covid-19. And a second program for tenants who are having difficulty paying rent due to Covid-19.

Landlords must Apply by June 6th. Call them at 847-263-7478 ext. 29.

For tenants, the Community Partners for Affordable Housing can help with rental assistance for up to 15 months, and possibly help with utilities. Income limits apply. There number is 847-263-7478 ext. 29.

MELVIN BROWN

2021 FATHER OF THE YEAR

Melvin T. Brown, Jr., 50, has been named 2021 Father of the Year by the Chicago Peoples Voice Newspaper. Brown and wife, Lori Annette Brown, 46, have been married for 19 years and they have 12 children. Their wedding anniversary is June 7th, 2021.

Lori was working as secretary to the principal at the North Chicago High School, and Melvin was on the security staff for the school. This is how they met.

“We started out as friends,” says Lori Brown. Lori explained that she and Melvin consulted on student discipline issues, and that occasionally they would go to the gym and work out. The relationship blossomed from there.

Melvin is a minister, who serves as the Associate Pastor at Unity Temple Mission Church of God in Christ at the corner of 500 S. Genevieve Street in Waukegan where the Pastor and Founder of the Church is Dr. Annie V. Hill. Dr. Hill is also Lori Brown’s mother.



The Brown Family

In addition to pastoring and being a great father to his children, Melvin works full time as a truck driver for J.B. Hunt where he has been driving for the last three years. Lori is a full-time mother, and a full-time student where she is working on a master's degree in Business Administration from Purdue Global University.

The Browns say that the biggest challenge that they have, "is teaching the bible and biblical principles with real life applications in this day and age". They help youth (especially their children and their children's friends) apply biblical principles to every aspect of their lives which includes education, school, and sports. For example: They encourage their children not to use curse words. This includes children in their church and school. There are other words that can be used to identify expressions rather than cursing. The Brown children do not curse.

Not only is Rev. Brown an associate pastor, but he is also the youth pastor for the church, youth leader, and men's ministry leader. He is also secretary of the North Shore District for associated Church of God in Christ organizations in the region.

"I love people," Brown articulated. Brown explained that because of his background he can reach out to and influence many people in many ways.

Brown is a disabled Veteran who served in the Airforce for three years during the Desert Storm conflict. He is a former police officer and has traveled all over the country driving trucks for fifteen years. Through these experiences he has learned to speak Spanish and Polish.

Brown said that he has a heart for reaching Men for the Kingdom. He recalls going to football games to support his sons and looking around and seeing 39 boys on the football field and only two fathers in the audience.

"Many youths do not have a male figure in their lives," says Rev. Brown. "Young men need the support and love of a father figure."

The Browns say that they would like to purchase 50 acres of land and build a home that would accommodate their large family. The home would be a heritage for their children. One day, says Lori, she would like to open an accredited childcare learning facility.

The names of the Brown children are as follows from the oldest to the youngest. Lorraine Hill, Jarriel Brown, DeVaughn Augustus, Zipporah Brown, Amariah Brown, David Brown, Hadassah Brown, Serah Brown, Benaiah Brown, Rebekah Brown, Rachel Brown, Simeon Brown. Evelyn Alexander Has Passed

Evelyn was very active with Big Brother/Big Sisters. She also was the driving force behind the "First Tee" of Lake County program, which brought golf to young people in North Chicago and throughout the county. She served as Chairman of the University of Illinois Cooperative Extension Council.

Evelyn's longest volunteer service was as a member of the College of Lake County Lakeshore Campus Advisory Board, where she served for more than 35 years. She was a member of the North Chicago Housing Authority, which was one of her favorite appointments. She was also very active with Eureka Temple #1172.

Renaming of North School in North Chicago

When Evelyn was asked what the one experience in her life was that she would never forget, she responded, "In addition to the birth of my children, it would be having a school named after me." She went on to say, "I will never be able to thank Dora King, the Independent Authority and the Financial Oversight Committee of District #187 for this wonderful recognition. I still cry when I think about it and I make my daughter drive me by the school every time we get in the car."

Evelyn was a champion for children in North Chicago. She invested more than 60 years of her time to ensure that children in North Chicago were afforded an opportunity to receive an excellent education.

While Evelyn's children were in school she often volunteered as a chaperone for field trips and sports events. As a result of Evelyn's commitment to education and her longevity as a volunteer, Novak-King designated Evelyn's home as a safe haven for the children in the area.

Evelyn is the only resident to be appointed and/or elected to every school board district in the history of the City of North Chicago. Evelyn never lost a school board election, while serving on Grade School District 63, Grade School Districts 64, High School District 123, and North Chicago Community Unit District 187. On June 19, 2012, the State Board of Education appointed Evelyn as a member of the Independent Authority for North Chicago Unit School District 187.

Evelyn attended First Corinthian Missionary Baptist church for several years before she officially became a member in 1968, under the leadership of Pastor Peter Goudeaux, Jr. Evelyn and her children would walk to Sunday School and stay for Sunday services.

Evelyn supported every ministry at First Corinthian. She especially enjoyed the grand teas sponsored by the Mission Ministry. She would delight in decorating the November table with other women who celebrated their birthdays in November.

Evelyn began her earthly journey on All Saints Day, November 1, 1936 in Evanston, IL. Her parents were Milton P. Harrison and Bessie Mae Harrison. Evelyn began her eternal life on Friday, May 14, 2021.

Evelyn was educated in the Evanston public school system. She matriculated with honors from Evanston Township High School, in 1954.

Evelyn married Benjamin F. Alexander, Jr., in 1956. Together they had four children: Cynthia, Cheryl, Christina, and Benjamin, III.

Evelyn and Benjamin left Evanston in 1958, shortly after their first child was born. Ben was employed at United States Steel and Evelyn was employed at what was then known as Downey Veterans' Administration. Evelyn was employed all her life; however, her favorite job was contributing to the academic success of her children.

All of Evelyn's children were educated in the North Chicago school system. Cynthia has a law degree from the University of Iowa, Cheryl has a dual master's degree from Ohio State, Christina has an associate degree in merchandise marketing and Benjamin is a former firefighter, paramedic and United States veteran.

Volunteerism

During her life, Evelyn volunteered with numerous organizations. She was a past president of the North Chicago Rotary Club, past vice president of Partners in Progress and a founding member of the Solid Waste

Evelyn was always there for the children's ministry; including making sure that she attended youth led services, helping with Easter speeches, and supporting fundraisers. She would be one of the first members to purchase tickets for the Ushers' salad spread.

One of Evelyn's proudest moments of service, was serving on the Pastor's Search Committee after the retirement of Pastor Peter Goudeaux, Jr. She spoke eloquently and passionately during the church meeting on behalf of then Minister Eugene Roberson. When the vote was taken, Eugene Roberson was the next pastor of First Corinthian.

Awards

Evelyn has received numerous awards and accolades throughout the

years. Evelyn has been selected Outstanding School Board Member and has also received several citations from federal, state and local entities including: State of Illinois Outstanding ESDA Director, YWCA Women of Achievement Award for Public Service, Lake County Forest Preserve "Doing Good in the Hood," First Corinthian Missionary Baptist Church Senior of the Year, People's Voice Lifetime Achievement Award, U of I Mother of the Year and City of North Chicago Hall of Fame. When Evelyn's children were young, she accepted a position as a dispatcher with the North Chicago Police Department. She was quickly promoted to Health Commissioner and Emergency Services Disaster Agency Coordinator by the late Mayor Leo F. Kukla. Evelyn retired as Chief of Staff to Mayor Bobby E. Thompson in 1997, after 27 years of service.

New partnership with DePaul University at CLC offers working adults affordable bachelor's degree

The University Center of Lake County (UCLC) at College of Lake County's (CLC) Grayslake Campus announces a new partnership with DePaul University offering students the opportunity to start their affordable educational career with an associate degree at CLC and end with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Professional Studies (BAPS) with a major in business administration from DePaul – entirely at the Grayslake Campus.

“This partnership is a great opportunity for working adult students to pursue an advanced credential necessary for the local business needs in Lake County,” said CLC Vice President of Community and Workforce Partnerships Dr. Ali O’Brien. “The practical business curriculum provides exposure to a variety of interests including technology, project management, marketing and operations, gearing up the next generation of business leaders. But most importantly, it’s an affordable and flexible option for students who are busy working.”

Students in this program can earn an associate of arts, associate of applied science in business or, with equivalent credit hours, the ability to complete a bachelor's degree in business administration on-site in Grayslake. This degree is offered through DePaul's School of Continuing and Professional Studies

(SCPS), a long-standing leader of providing educational opportunities for working adults.

“Adult learners appreciate the value of pathways that extend opportunities sans disruption,” said Dr. Tatum Thomas, dean of DePaul's School of Continuing and Professional Studies. “With the complement of the CLC and SCPS offerings, graduates will be poised to create impact in their professions and society — they will continue on life-changing paths.”

Students who take advantage of this pathway pay discounted tuition rates 25 percent lower than the university's undergraduate tuition. The courses are taught by DePaul faculty both on-site at UCLC and online. DePaul's classes in this program are scheduled to meet two evenings a week at UCLC as a part-time program, with some courses being offered online. Students join a cohort model for taking courses, allowing them to establish a network they'll carry throughout their careers.

Students also receive dedicated advising from SCPS to provide support as they balance work, home and school demands. BAPS builds knowledge and skills for employment in corporate and nonprofit settings. In this program, students build a skill set in project management, human resources, risk management, leadership, workplace law, globalization, ethical conduct, data analytics and professional communication needed to succeed in their career.

Interested students who want to stay close to home while earning an affordable bachelor's degree at UCLC should request information to review academic goals and create a personal academic success plan.


