## THE E. REED REPORT

ONCE AGAIN, I ABDICATE THE PEN TO

WITH AN ARTICLE  
ABOUT LEADERSHIP

**I**n your personal or professional life, breakdowns occur. When I say breakdowns, it includes problems, disruptions, challenges, chaos, misfortune, disaster, etc. When it comes to business, in many cases, the larger the goal the larger the breakdown. If you're a leader, the way you handle those problems can dictate the culture of your enterprise. And that can affect the company's ability to succeed.

If you typically shy away from big problems, leadership may not be appealing to you. A big part of leadership's job is to handle and correct major disruptions. Perhaps if there were no problems in the world there would be no need for leadership. Since businesses are constantly growing, it is likely people

will have to accomplish something they have never done in the past. On that new path, there will be chances to encounter challenges that have not been faced by people in the organization.

At first, new challenges can appear insurmountable. Depending on the complexity of the disruption, it could be analogous to a two-year-old learning to tie their shoes for the first time. In some cases, staff and management will have to use existing resources and problem-solving skills to overcome the challenge. However, when they come to an impasse, that is when leadership plays a significant role.

If leadership is easily flustered and annoyed with problems, there is a chance they will avoid large scale initiatives. While those initiatives can be filled with obstacles, they can lead to new revenue growth and an opportunity to lead your industry. Except, if the ability to deal with those obstacles is low, a company can be derailed. Constant derailment with new opportunities can be very expensive.

On the surface, it may sound as though I am saying leadership must be able to control themselves in the face of chaos. Without question, I am not saying that. Control is a myth. If you doubt that, control your mind to stop thinking anything for five minutes. Most will find that to be a difficult task. Therefore, whether the problem involves exceeding budget, a conflict between colleagues or constant failure, it is how leadership sees themselves in the face of those breakdowns that matters most. That perception is the result of training, not controlling.

Too often, people don't deal with what is occurring. They make up stories in their head about what happened. For example, if teams refuse to collaborate, leadership can start to blame themselves. With that mindset, they may become defensive because they see the problem as their fault. They will believe they hired the wrong people or they may believe they are a poor leader. That can create blind spots. Why? Because the leader is not focused on the real problem. They are attempting to figure out what is wrong with him/her or other people. That can lead to anger with others. And that anger becomes the mask to hide the fact they believe they, the leader, maybe the problem.

On the other hand, if leadership understands that breakdowns occur and it is part of any initiative, they can start to ask the right questions when disruptions occur. It is likely they will ask questions that no one else is asking. That gets people focused on the source of the problem.

With that said, it is not breakdowns or chaos that is a problem. It is how you see yourself that dictates the way you respond to whatever is occurring. If you make up a story based on negative presuppositions, it is likely that frustration will ensue. In other words, it is not the problem that is a problem. It is how you handle yourself in your own head that creates problems or solutions. When you understand that, you begin to see that problems are often not the problems they first appeared to be.

# Community Action Celebrates 54 Years

## With Anti-Poverty Walk and Awards Reception

The Community Action Partnership of Lake County celebrated their 54th Anniversary in May with an Anti-Poverty 5K Walk on Saturday, May 5, 2018 and an awards reception on Thursday, May 10, 2018.

### The Anti-Poverty Walk

Several area dignitaries attended the Anti-Poverty Walk including U.S. Congressman Brad Schneider, Mayor Sam Cunningham, and Lake County Commissioner Mary Cunningham,

“Standing together, we can make sure that our communities are strong,” said US Congressman Brad Schneider who, with his family members, attended and participated in the 5K Walk.

The Honorable Mayor of the City of Waukegan, Sam Cunningham, said that often the people that agencies like Community Action serve don't always act like staffers want them to act, but we need to serve them anyway.

“They may grow up to be a Congressman, Mayor, or Township Supervisor,” Mayor Cunningham said.

Executive Director, Mary White addressed the audience and provided a historical perspective of the agency citing President Johnson's 1964 War on Poverty which was committed to wiping our poverty in America.

White said that the Community Action Agency history is intertwined with the Great Society, War on Poverty, and the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964.

“This past year, our Agency has served 24,000 families in Lake County and empowered them to attain self-sufficiency. We are particularly proud to have graduated 13 young adults from the Job Readiness Training Summer Program and served 542 children in the Head Start program. Our work changes lives and strengthens our entire community,” says Mary White.

## US jobs now equal number of jobless

A record number of U.S. job openings is about on par with the number of jobless, Bloomberg says. Citing the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey for March, the most recent data available from the Labor Department, the news service said the “quits rate” also rose to 2.3% from 2.2% in February, increasing pressure for higher wages. The equilibrium between those looking for work and 2.3 million job openings compares with the beginning of the Great Recession in 2007, when there were “1.9 people” for every opening.

## Lake County Board Toes the Line on Pay Raises

The Lake County Board of Commissioners voted last month to toe-the-line and not take a pay increase. Current board members are paid \$40,945 per year along with other perks. The Board Chairman, Aaron Lawler, makes about \$83,937 and receives about \$7,000 for car allowances. He also receives a 2.5 annual increase when regular county

employees receive their annual raises.

## U.S. Department of Justice Expands Civil Service Commission

Due to several litigations, the U.S. Department of Justice, about a year ago, established a goal for the City of Waukegan to encourage racial and gender diversity within their firefighter and police departments. As a result, the Waukegan City Council voted in May to expand the city’s Civil Service Commission to five members rather than three to watch over the hiring practices of these two city departments. The goal is to hire more minorities and women in the police and fire organizations. Rick Harris, a diversity consultant, was retained early in the year and paid \$75,000 annually to help manage diversity issues and provide sensitivity training.

**W**e are proud of the role we play in the continuing fight against poverty during this period of economic turmoil. The new challenges facing Community Action have strengthened our determination to help people help themselves.

We have accomplished this through the programs services and advocacy work that we do daily. During 2017, we were able to assist over 8,028 Lake County residents with utility bills through our Low – Income Energy Assistance Program, 134 houses received energy conservation work at no cost to the home owner. The program spent an average of \$8,268 per house. 1,438 individuals and families received emergency assistance, food pantry donations, self-sufficiency case management or post secondary scholarships. Students were awarded scholarships to Illinois Institutions of higher education or vocational training schools.

Early Childhood Education, nutrition and health services were provided to over 700 children and families. A total of 52 affordable multi-family and single family homes; plus townhouses were leased to low-to-moderate income indi-

165 Children 5-12 years of age from at-risk communities enjoyed fun-filled summer camp activities and field trips at affordable rates last summer. And, over 100 volunteers donated their time with helping people and changing lives.

Community Action Partnership of Lake County continues to develop new joint initiatives and partnerships to better serve the needy and working poor in Lake County.

Poverty was a huge problem in America prior to the recession, a problem that was far too big for most communities to solve alone. NOW, we must join hands, roll up our sleeves and prepare to actively fight poverty together, if we desire a stronger America.

Initially, Nelson supported corporate clients in the areas defined contribution and defined benefit pension plans but in 2015, he migrated to Aon's Retiree Health Exchange. In the past 3 yrs. Nelson has enrolled over 1,000 retirees in Medicare and prescription drug plans; reviewed plan documentation relative to CMS enrollment & election guidelines, contracted to provide coverage through

preferred carriers such as Humana, United Health Care/AARP, Aetna, Mutual of Omaha, BCBS, Health Net, Silver Script and Kaiser. He is licensed to sell in IL., NY., SC. LA., GA., TX., MS. & CA and is AHIP (America's Health Insurance Plans) Certified through the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

In March 2018, Nelson decided to retire from Aon and join the Medicare ranks. # Pastor & Sister Roberson Celebrate 24th Church Anniversary

## National Baptist Convention President, Rev. Stephen Thurston Keynotes

The First Corinthian M.B. Church celebrated their pastor's 24th Church Anniversary on May 17. The senior pastor of First Corinthian is the Reverend Eugene Roberson, the event featured The Reverend Stephen Thurston, President of the National Baptist Convention, who is also Pastor of the New Covenant M.B. Church of Chicago. Thurston preached on the topic of "Let The Church Say Amen".

The spirited celebration included songs by the Voices of Corinthian and a powerful choreography by a mime team consisting of the youth department of the church. Minister Nelson Tate was the Master of Ceremonies for the event.

### **More about the keynote speaker...**

Stephen John Thurston is the third generation to pastor the New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church. Like his grandfather and father before him, Thurston preaches every Sunday to his Southside Chicago congregation. A charismatic leader and dynamic preacher, his church has grown to over 2,000 members.

At an early age, Thurston was preparing and being prepared to step into his father's shoes to become the third generation to minister at New Covenant. In 1967 Thurston's father invited Martin Luther King, Jr., to preach at New Covenant. He asked King to address three issues: achieving personal goals, improving the welfare those in need, and working to glorify God. Thurston, just 15 years old at the time, found inspira-

tion in King's words.

Thurston graduated from John M. Harlan High School in Chicago in 1970 and attended the now-defunct Bishop College in Dallas, Texas, from where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in religion in 1975. He also completed advanced studies at Wheaton Christian College in Wheaton, Illinois. He married his grade school sweetheart, Joyce D. Hand, on June 18, 1977. They have four children: Stephen John II, Nicole D'-Vaugh, Teniece Rael, and Christian Avery Elijah.

Thurston first ascended to the pulpit of New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church on Easter Sunday of 1971, delivering the sermon "Where Did You Die?" On Easter Sunday three years later, in 1974, Thurston's father laid hands on his son and ordained him. Thurston thus entered the ministry as an assistant pastor under his father's tutelage. Again on an Easter Sunday, just one year later, Thurston made another step in his journey when his father appointed him as co-pastor to serve alongside him in equal capacity. When his father passed away on January 21, 1979, Thurston, like his father before him, became the sole spiritual leader of New Covenant.

Much of the tremendous growth of New Covenant, which has gone from a member of 50 in 1934 to over 2,000 in 2004, can be at-

tributed to Thurston's dynamic and energetic ministry. He was named one of "America's Best and Brightest Young Business and Professional Men" by Dollars and Sense magazine in 1987, and Manya A. Brachear of the Chicago Tribune reported in 2003, "Congregants who have known all three pastors said Stephen Thurston inherited his grandfather's booming voice and conservative values and his father's charisma and activist aspirations." Many of his sermons are available as a transcript or on tape or CD.


